## **2001 SENATE BILL 195**

May 30, 2001 – Introduced by Senators M. MEYER, RISSER, ROBSON and ROSENZWEIG, cosponsored by Representatives JOHNSRUD, BERCEAU, SCHOOFF and STASKUNAS. Referred to Committee on Universities, Housing, and Government Operations.

1 AN ACT *to amend* 39.30 (2) (intro.) of the statutes; **relating to:** eligibility for 2 Wisconsin tuition grants.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a resident student who is enrolled at least half-time at an accredited, nonprofit Wisconsin college or university is eligible for a tuition grant. This bill makes a resident student who is enrolled at least half-time in a Wisconsin branch or campus of an accredited, nonprofit college or university located in another state eligible for a tuition grant.

## *The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

- **SECTION 1.** 39.30 (2) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:
- 4 39.30 (2) ELIGIBILITY. (intro.) A resident student who is enrolled at least
- 5 half-time and registered as a freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior in an
- 6 accredited, nonprofit, post-high school, educational institution in this state <u>or who</u>
- 7 <u>is so enrolled and registered in an in-state branch or campus of an accredited.</u>
