The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 103.85 (2) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

103.85 (2) (c) Persons employed in the manufacture of butter, cheese or other
dairy products or in the distribution of milk or cream, or in canneries and freezers,
except as provided in sub. (2m).

SECTION 2. 103.85 (2) (cm) of the statutes is created to read:

1 103.85 (2) (cm) Persons described in sub. (2m) who voluntarily agree to work
2 for 7 or more consecutive days without 24 consecutive hours of rest in those 7 or more
3 days.

4 **SECTION 3.** 103.85 (2m) of the statutes is created to read:

5 103.85 (2m) Notwithstanding sub. (2) (c) and except as provided in sub. (2)
6 (cm), this section applies to a person who is employed exclusively in the production
7 of pasteurized processed cheese products that have expiration dates that are not less
8 than 60 days after the date on which the products were packaged.

9 **SECTION 4. Initial applicability.**

10 (1) This act first applies to persons who are affected by a collective bargaining
11 agreement that contains provisions inconsistent with section 103.85 (2) (cm) and
12 (2m) of the statutes, as created by this act, on the day on which the collective
13 bargaining agreement expires or is extended, modified or renewed, whichever occurs
14 first.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, subject to certain exceptions, every employer who owns or operates a factory or mercantile establishment must allow every person employed in the factory or mercantile establishment to have at least 24 consecutive hours of rest in every period of seven consecutive days (one day of rest in seven). Currently, an employer of a person employed in the manufacture of butter, cheese or other dairy products, ~~or~~ in the distribution of milk or cream, or in a cannery or freezer, is not required to allow the person to have one day of rest in seven. This bill requires a person ~~employed in the manufacture of butter, cheese or other dairy products subsequent to the first processing of the milk from which those products are made~~ to be given one day of rest in seven, unless the person voluntarily agrees to work without one day of rest in seven. ~~The bill, however, continues the exception to the one day of rest in seven law for persons employed in the first processing of milk,~~
