Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Because this bill would create a new criminal (and juvenile delinquency) offense and would increase the provisions of juvenile court orders that could lead to post-disposition hearings, it would result in increased costs to the State Public Defender.

The bill could also increase county costs if alleged offenders are detained in county jails (either pretrial or post-disposition).
