

**SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,  
TO 2001 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 30**

January 8, 2002 – Offered by COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES.

1     **Relating to:** memorializing the U.S. Congress to provide funding for research on  
2             lumber salvaging by the Forest Products Laboratory of the U.S. Department of  
3             Agriculture Forest Service.

      PREFATORY NOTE: This joint resolution was prepared for the joint legislative  
      council's special committee on the historic building code. The joint legislative council  
      established the special committee and directed it to study the Wisconsin historic building  
      code and its administration to ensure that the code effectively facilitates practical,  
      cost-effective and safe historic rehabilitation projects, as well as any related issues.

4             Whereas, during the last century, millions of residential homes, commercial  
5             and industrial buildings, bridges, and other structures have been built from sawn  
6             lumber; and

7             Whereas, many of these structures are being demolished, resulting in the loss  
8             of old growth, high quality lumber potentially available for reuse; and

9             Whereas, maximizing the reuse of lumber from demolished structures has  
10            many positive environmental consequences such as reducing the volume of
