4 Whereas, September 11, 2001, terrorist forces committed multiple acts of war
5 against the United States of America; and

6 Whereas, the people of the state of Wisconsin mourn the thousands of innocent
7 citizens viciously killed in these attacks; and

8 Whereas, the U.S. Congress overwhelmingly authorized the President to use
9 force against these terrorists; and

10 Whereas, the American way of life depends upon American leadership to
11 ensure its existence for future generations; now, therefore, be it

12 ***Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That*** the Wisconsin
13 legislature expresses its support for the use of all force necessary to accomplish this
14 nation’s goal of ridding the world of the threat of terrorism; and, be it further

1 **Resolved, That** the Wisconsin legislature expresses its support for our troops;
2 and, be it further

3 **Resolved, That** the senate chief clerk shall provide a copy of this joint
4 resolution to the President of the United States, to the president and the secretary
5 of the U.S. senate, to the speaker and clerk of the U.S. house of representatives, and
6 to each member of the congressional delegation from this state attesting the adoption
7 of this joint resolution by the 2001 legislature of the state of Wisconsin.
