

## 2001 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 58

January 30, 2002 – Introduced by Senators PANZER, DARLING, ROSENZWEIG, A. LASEE, HUELSMAN, SCHULTZ, KANAVAS, WELCH, LAZICH, S. FITZGERALD, ROESSLER and ZIEN, cosponsored by Representatives JENSEN, GUNDERSON, VRAKAS, SYKORA, J. FITZGERALD, OWENS, KESTELL, KREIBICH, TURNER, MUSSER, HUEBSCH, KRAWCZYK, LEIBHAM, MCCORMICK, TOWNSEND, LADWIG, HAHN, OLSEN, OTT, JESKEWITZ, GROTHMAN, PETTIS, ALBERS and MILLER. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

1     **Relating to:** recognizing February 6 as Ronald Reagan Day.

2             Whereas, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background,  
3 worked throughout his life serving freedom and advancing the public good by his  
4 employment as an entertainer, union leader, corporate spokesman, governor of  
5 California, and President of the United States; and

6             Whereas, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction for 2 terms as the  
7 40th President of the United States of America; the 2nd of which he earned the  
8 confidence of three-fifths of the electorate and was victorious in 49 of the 50 states  
9 in the general election, which is a record unsurpassed in the history of American  
10 presidential elections; and

11            Whereas, in 1981, when Ronald Reagan was inaugurated President, he faced  
12 numerous challenges including inflation and high unemployment rates; and

13            Whereas, during Mr. Reagan's presidency, he worked in a bipartisan manner  
14 to enact his bold agenda of restoring accountability and common sense to

1 government, which led to an unprecedented economic expansion and opportunity for  
2 millions of Americans; and

3 Whereas, Mr. Reagan's commitment to an active social policy agenda for the  
4 nation's children helped lower crime and drug use in our neighborhoods; and

5 Whereas, President Reagan's commitment to our armed forces contributed to  
6 the restoration of pride in America and her armed forces to win the Gulf War; and

7 Whereas, President Reagan's vision of "peace through strength" led to the end  
8 of the Cold War and the end of the Soviet Union, restoring democracy to a region long  
9 under communist rule; and

10 Whereas, on February 6, 2002, Ronald Reagan will reach the age of ninety one  
11 years; now, therefore, be it

12 ***Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That*** the legislature of  
13 the state of Wisconsin hereby recognizes February 6 as Ronald Reagan Day.
