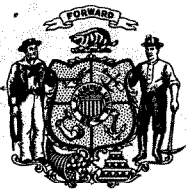

The way the language currently is drafted, the types of low-income health care screening services that are offered are not specified. This means that while DHFS may include breast cancer screening in the screening services, it isn't required so I didn't specify breast cancer screening in the analysis. The language can be easily amended to specify breast cancer screening services and then I can change the analysis. One question though, are the low-income health care screening grants supposed to fund breast cancer screening services or is it just the media announcements that are supposed to alert women of the availability of breast cancer screening under the breast cancer screening program? Please let me know your intent and then I will make the necessary changes to the language and analysis.
