- 1) Amend s. 281.68 (2) to increase the maximum lake planning grant award to \$25,000.
- 2) Amend s. 281.68 (3) (a) to list school districts as eligible recipients of lake management planning grants where the local school board has adopted a resolution describing a lake management purpose and a relationship with another eligible recipient.
- 3) Amend s. 281.69 (3) (b) 2. to specify shoreland and littoral zone restoration as designated eligible activity for lake management project grants. (e.g. The restoration of a wetland, as defined in s. 23.32 (1), and in-lake or shoreline habitat, if the restoration will protect or improve a lake's water quality or its natural ecosystem.)

Explanatory Note:

- 1) Larger lakes and lakes with technical and complex planning needs are often limited by the current \$10,000 maximum lake planning grant award. As a result, many sponsors apply for more than one grant to complete a study or plan, thus complicating the ranking procedure and requiring artificial phasing of projects resulting in disjointed study efforts. Administratively, it is more difficult to track and manage several grants for one project. Allowing for a class of larger grants would reduce paperwork and result in more well designed studies.
- 2) Allowing school districts to sponsor grants in cooperation with other eligible sponsors will increase youth and community involvement in lake management, Adopt-a-Lake, Project WET, WAVE, and Self Help Lake Monitoring programs and stimulate projects on lakes where existing management organizations may be reluctant to apply for and manage a grant-funded project.
- 3) There is an increasing demand for shoreland and littoral lake management projects. By placing these conditions in rule, updating and keeping them current with existing conditions will be easier and more efficient.

Comments/changes for LRB-0353/1:

- 1. In regards to your drafter's note question, DNR and I are okay with the way the school district language is drafted.
- 2. DNR requests, and I am fine with, separating shoreland restoration grants out under s. 281.69(3)(b), rather than including them under s. 281.69(3)(b)2. DNR also wants the language to make clear that shoreland restoration grants may include projects in the littoral (shallow areas) of lakes.
- 3. Modify the draft to retain the current \$10,000 maximum for grants (unless a lake association qualifies as a premiere lake -- see below)
- 4. Create a premiere lakes program. Lake associations under this program would meet certain additional criteria and be eligible for grants from the current lake grant appropriation. In order to participate in the premiere lakes program, the following criteria must be met. The lake association must:
 - have at least 50% paid membership of all eligible individuals;
 - hold two regularly scheduled property owners' meeting per year;
 - distribute one published newsletter annually;
 - promote yearly septic system monitoring and encourage owners to upgrade failing systems;
 - promote the use of phosphate-free environmentally safe soaps by lake property owners:
 - promote awareness of water safety:
 - promote protection of the natural fish population and wildlife;
 - actively raise funds for 1) signs at public boat landings to raise awareness of invasive aquatic plants and animals and general water safety, 2) washing stations at public boat landings, 3) in-kind contributions to assist DNR's control efforts for invasive species, 4) property owner's manuals promoting lake property owner responsibility for managing lake resources, and 5) regularly completed lake surveys to monitor water quality;



NAVIGABLE WATERS

Under current law, DNR administers two grant programs to address water quality problems specifically in lakes. Under the first program, DNR provides grants for planning projects to provide education information on the use of lakes and their ecosystems and on the quality of water in lakes. These grants are for 75% of the project's costs up to \$10,000 per project. Under the second program, DNR provides grants for management projects that will improve or protect the quality of water in lakes or in their ecosystems. Nonprofit conservation organizations, most units of local government, and lake associations that meet certain requirements (qualified lake associations) are eligible for grants under these programs.

This bill makes the following changes to the lake planning grant program:

1. It increases the \$10,000 cap per project to \$25,000 for certain lake associations that qualify as "premiery" lake associations. To be a premiery lake association, the lake association must meet all of the requirements of a qualified lake association and must meet certain additional requirements that include having a specified minimum number of members current in their membership dues, having at least two meetings per year, promoting water safety, and promoting and raising



funds for activities and equipment that help protect the environmental quality of each inland lake for which the association was incorporated.

2. It allows a school district to be eligible for a planning grant if the school district will be cooperating in the planning project with another entity that is eligible

to receive a planning grant.
