Subject: TEACH - Department of Corrections Request for TEACH Services

Please revise the statutes so that the following Department of Corrections juvenile institutions -- the Southern Oaks Girls School, Ethan Allen School, Lincoln Hills School and the Youth Leadership Training Center -- are eligible for TEACH funding. The four institutions will be eligible to receive: (a) educational technology block grants; (b) educational technology training & technical assistance grants; (c) telecommunications access services; and (d) wiring loans. Create a separate appropriation for telecommunications access services, and separate GPR and PR appropriations for wiring loans. Specify that if a juvenile facility receives a T-1 or DS-3 from the TEACH Board, the T-1 or DS-3 can only be used for educational purposes. Direct the Department of Corrections to submit information to the State Budget Office regarding the funding the department is saving by receiving TEACH funding.

Under current law, school districts and other educational agencies are eligible to receive technology block grants (to be used for any purpose related to educational technology), educational technology training and technical assistance grants, loans to fund the installation and upgrading of computer network wiring, and subsidized access to new data lines and video links.
