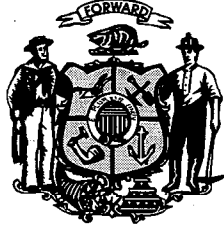

Brief Description of Intent:

As of FY 2000, the APPPS Board became the lead agency for the annual statewide Pathways to Teen Pregnancy Prevention and Intervention Conference. As such, this agency handles all monies (receivables and payables) which includes donations from sponsors (public and private), participant registrations, payment of speakers and hotels, continuing education credits, etc. Conference monies need to be kept separate from the APPPS Board operating and grant accounts. Monies left over are used as start up funds for the next year's conference. Therefore, this appropriation needs to be a continuing account (monies do not lapse at the end of a fiscal year).

Brief Description of Intent:

Attach the APPPS Board to the Department of Administration (DOA) rather than the Department of Health and Family Services (DHFS).

The Executive Director of the Wisconsin Women's Council (WWC) serves as Chair of the APPPS Board and supervises the APPPS Board Administrator. The WWC is attached to DOA for administrative purposes. The APPPS Board is attached to DHFS for administrative purposes. The WWC and the APPPS Board share office space in order to maximize financial resources. DHFS and DOA have different purchasing, personnel, budget, etc. procedures that each small agency must adhere to. WWC and APPPS Board staff are unable to share knowledges, resources, etc. because of this difference. If both agencies were attached to one department, one purchase order with two funding codes could be used to purchase shared office equipment - each agency would be charged equally. Currently, for example, one agency purchases a copier - the other agency then "contributes its share" by purchasing paper for the copier. In addition, DOA (through its InfoTech/SASI program) already provides support and maintenance for the APPPS Board information systems.

Under current law, the adolescent pregnancy prevention and pregnancy services board (APPPS board), which is attached to DHFS for administrative purposes, is required to award grants to organizations that provide pregnancy prevention programs or pregnancy services to persons under 18 years of age. An organization that receives a grant from the APPPS board must provide matching funds equal to 20% of the grant amount awarded, but may not use any moneys received from the state government toward meeting that matching funds requirement. This bill expands the persons who may be served under a grant awarded by the APPPS board to persons under 22 years of age. The bill also prohibits an organization that receives a grant from the APPPS board from using moneys received from the federal, as well as the state, government toward meeting the matching funds requirement under the grant. Further, the bill transfers the APPS board from DHFS to DOA for administrative purposes. Finally, the bill creates a program revenue appropriation, consisting of all moneys received relating to conferences conducted by the APPPS board, for payment of the costs of conducting those conferences.

Under current law, the adolescent pregnancy prevention and pregnancy services board (APPPS board), which is attached to DHFS for administrative purposes, is required to award grants to organizations that provide pregnancy prevention programs or pregnancy services to persons under 18 years of age. An organization that receives a grant from the APPPS board must provide matching funds equal to 20% of the grant amount awarded, but may not use any moneys received from the state government toward meeting that matching funds requirement. ~~This bill expands the persons who may be served under a grant awarded by the APPPS board to persons under 22 years of age.~~ The bill also prohibits an organization that receives a grant from the APPPS board from using moneys received from the federal, as well as the state, government toward meeting the matching funds requirement under the grant. Further, the bill transfers the APPPS board from DHFS to DOA for administrative purposes. Finally, the bill creates a program revenue appropriation, consisting of all moneys received relating to conferences conducted by the APPPS board, for payment of the costs of conducting those conferences.
