Existing Programs

1. Educational Technology Block Grants -- Reporting Requirement

**Current Law:** Under current law, school districts are not required to report block grant expenditures to the board.

**Change:** Require school districts to report expenditures annually to the TEACH Board regarding use of block grant funds.

**Rationale:** At the close of fiscal year 2001, \$132.0 million in block grant funds will have been disbursed to school districts since the creation of TEACH. There is no mechanism in place to gather data on how the funds are used by school districts. The data is essential for TEACH to fulfill performance-based budgeting obligations, monitor program compliance, and to improve planning and coordination of educational technology resources.
