Brownfields Grant Program -- Eliminate Three Funding Levels. Eliminate the language in s. 560.13 (4) (a) and (am), Stats., requiring Commerce to spend a specific amount on small, medium, and large brownfields grants in each funding cycle. Currently, Commerce must award \$870,000 in grants that do not exceed \$300,000; \$2,030,000 in grants that are greater than \$300,000 but that do not exceed \$700,000; and \$2,900,000 in grants that are greater than \$700,000 but do not exceed \$1,250,000.

Brownfields Grant Program -- Eliminate Small Communities Requirement. This change deletes the statutory language in s.

PJK

560.13 (4) (c), Stats., that requires the Department to make seven awards to communities under 30,000 in population.

H. Brownfields Grant Program -- Eliminate Three Funding Levels

Eliminate ss. 560.13 (4) (a) and (am), which require Commerce to spend a specific amount on small, medium, and large brownfields grants in each funding cycle. Currently, in FY01, Commerce must award \$960,000 in grants that do not exceed \$300,000; \$2,240,000 in grants that are greater than \$300,000 but that do not exceed \$700,000; and \$3,200,000 in grants that are greater than \$700,000 but do not exceed \$1,250,000. These requirements inhibit Commerce's ability to make awards to the most deserving projects.

I. Brownfields Grant Program -- Eliminate Small Communities Requirement

Delete the statutory language in s. 560.13 (4) (c) that requires the Department to make seven awards to communities under 30,000 in population. These requirements inhibit Commerce's ability to make awards to the most deserving projects.
