Subject: Budget draft request relating to Byrne funding for drug prosecutor positions in Milwaukee and Dane Counties

I am requesting non-statutory language be drafted for inclusion with the 2001-03 biennial budget bill.

As in past budgets, the full-funding of three anti-drug prosecutors in Milwaukee County and one in Dane County will be handled as a non-statutory provision. This action serves as an earmark of federal Byrne anti-drug and matching money administered by the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA). Local multi-jurisdictional task forces provide funding for these ADAs to assist them in anti-drug prosecution.

Under the provision, OJA will be required to send \$277,900 in FY02 and \$291,400 in FY03 to Milwaukee County and \$84,000 in FY02 and \$91,100 in FY03 to Dane County.

Simple updates to similar non-statutory language under Section 9101 in 1999 Wisconsin Act 9 should be sufficient.
