- RAE ✓ 1. Specify that seniority-based transfer rights for professional staff and choice of health-care provider are prohibited subjects of bargaining.
- MJL ✓ 2. Expand the special chartering status of UW-Milwaukee and Milwaukee Area Technical College to other UW and WTCS institutions and CESAs. These institutions could only create charter schools in school districts with membership counts, as determined for school aid purposes that exceed 10,000 members. *not an instrumentality*
Would set amt paid under 118.40(2)(e)
- PG ✓ 3. Expand eligibility for tuition aid under s. 121.79 20.255 (2) (cg) to include students that live in taxable foster group homes. The tuition payment shall be no greater than the prior year special education costs of such pupils that were not covered by federal or state special education aid payments.
- MJL ✓ 4. Reduce funding for the SAGE evaluation under s. 118.43 (7) to \$125,000 annually and require the department to determine the scope of the evaluation and select the reviewer through a competitive process that ensures impartiality.
- PG ✓ 5. Reduce summer school membership count for revenue limit purposes from the current law level of 40% to 25%.
- MJL ✓ 6. Eliminate the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (em), driver education local assistance.
- MJL ✓ 7. Allow Milwaukee charter schools chartered by UW-M, MATC and the City of Milwaukee to receive additional summer school aid in a manner similar to MPCP schools.
- PG ✓ 8. Eliminate the Sept. 1 school-start-date school district opt-out provision.
- PG ✓ 9. Pupil data disclosure - allow the state superintendent to release pupil data, if the pupil data is needed to perform an evaluation. The data can only be released to a researcher or research organization with which the state superintendent has contracted to perform an evaluation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau UW

Under current law, the ~~University of Wisconsin~~ Milwaukee, the Milwaukee area technical college, and the city of Milwaukee may sponsor charter schools for pupils residing in Milwaukee. The operators of these charter schools receive aid for the regular school term based on the number of pupils attending the charter school. School districts, however, are entitled to receive state aid for both the regular school term and for summer school.

This bill requires state aid to be paid to be operators of the Milwaukee charter schools for summer school.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 118.40 (2r) (a) of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

118.40 (2r) (a) In this subsection, "membership" means the sum of the number of pupils attending the charter school in the current school year and the summer

1 average daily membership equivalent, as defined in ~~s.~~^{s.} 121.004 (8), for the summer
 2 of the previous school year.

****NOTE: Peter: At your request, membership includes the summer average daily membership equivalent for the summer of the previous school year.

3 **SECTION 2.** 118.40 (2r) (e) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 118.40 (2r) (e) From the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (fm), the department
 5 shall pay to the operator of the charter school an amount equal to the sum of the
 6 amount paid per pupil under this paragraph in the previous school year and the
 7 amount of revenue increase per pupil allowed under subch. VII of ch. 121 in the
 8 current school year, multiplied by the ~~number of pupils attending the charter school~~
 9 membership. The department shall pay 25% of the total amount in September, 25%
 10 in December, 25% in February^Y and 25% in June. The department shall send the
 11 check to the operator of the charter school.

 20 under s. 121.07 (6).
