Please draft the following items for possible inclusion in the Governor's 2001-2003 biennial budget bill.

1. **Secondary Cost Ceiling.** S. 121.07 (6) (d) defines the secondary cost ceiling per member used to calculate school districts' equalization aid eligibility. Set the secondary cost ceiling to equal \$6,900 in FY02, \$7,300 in FY03 and for all subsequent years an amount equal to the previous year time the 1.0 plus the rate certified under s. 73.03 (46) expressed as a decimal. (63)
2. **Open Enrollment Payment Increase.** Under s. 118.51 (16) (a) (3), the full-time open enrollment payment is set at the statewide average per pupil cost for regular instruction, cocurricular activities, instructional support services and pupil support services. Change the payment amount to equal 75% of the statewide average per pupil cost. (632)
121.81 (1) (1st year)
3. **Declining Enrollment Provision.** Under s. 121.91 (4) (f), school districts that experience a decline in their three-year rolling membership average are eligible for a non-recurring revenue limit exemption equal to 75% of the revenue authority reduction resulting from the decline in enrollment. In addition to the current law provision, allow a district that experiences a decline in their three-year rolling average that is greater than or equal to 2% to receive in the second year after the decline a non-recurring exemption equal to one-half of the declining enrollment exemption provided in the prior year.
