4. **Failing schools report:** Require the State Superintendent to annually report to the public, the Legislature and the Governor the schools identified under s. 115.38. Require districts to review and develop a plan to make improvements in the operations of any school within their district that makes the list.

5. **Create a Panel to review DPI rules:** Create a panel of local educators to review DPI rules (except those related to special education and health and safety issues). The 11-member panel of gubernatorial appointees would consist of two members of the general public (one of which is a parent of a school-aged child), three school board members selected from nominations from WASB, three school district administrators selected from nominations from SAA, three teachers selected from nominations of organizations representing teachers. DPI would provide staff support to the panel. Require the panel to submit to DPI, by August 1, 2002, recommendations specifying which DPI administrative rules should be retained. Require DPI to promulgate administrative rules to put into effect the proposed changes by January 1, 2003. Specify that all existing DPI rules, except those related to special education and health and safety issues are repealed as of January 1, 2003 (i.e., replaced by the newly promulgated rules.) The repeal and recreation process should not include rules related to special education and health and safety issues.

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6. **DPI Reorganization.** Direct the State Superintendent to work with the Secretary of the Department of Administration to develop a reorganization plan to enhance DPI's capacity to support school improvement. The plan shall be submitted to the Secretary of the Department of Administration by March 15, 2002. The plan must accomplish the following:

- Reorganize the department's Division of Learning Support: Instructional Services to create a bureau of school improvement. Existing division staff, including subject area educational consultants, student services consultants, and Title I staff in the Division of Learning Support: Equity and Adequacy shall staff multidisciplinary teams of state employees and experienced licensed educators that will provide on-site technical assistance to school districts, in particular to schools that are included on the list of schools in need of improvement under s. 115.38. The experienced educators that will supplement DPI staff on the multidisciplinary teams will be hired as project employees of the department.
- The school improvement teams described above shall review school operations including school organization and management, school climate and culture, curriculum and instruction, parental involvement.
- As part of the reorganization, DPI shall request additional project positions to provide the authority to hire experienced educators to complement DPI staff on the school improvement teams.
- Assure the department has the capacity to assist schools in designing and implementing decentralized school governance systems.
- Administer the Building Based Management Grant Program and the School Leadership Grant Program.

Furthermore, provide \$700,000 GPR in FY03 for salary, fringe benefits and supplies and services expenditures associated with employing experienced licensed educators to serve on the school improvement teams described above. 7. **Create a revolving loan fund for Charter School Start up costs.** Create a revolving loan fund from which the department will award loans to school districts to support the development of charter schools. Funding can be used for capital expenditures, staff development activities, curriculum development and other costs associated with the start-up of schools chartered by a school board. Provide one-time funding of \$1.0 million GPR in a new appropriation, plus direct department to use \$1.0 million in federal charter school funding to capitalize the revolving loan fund. Loans from the fund are to be repaid over a five-year period, with the first annual repayment made during the fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the loan was awarded.
8. **Special Ed rules:** Require the State Superintendent to ensure that all special education rules promulgated by the department are identical to federal guidelines.
9. **Virtual Education Rulemaking:** Require, that prior to promulgating any rules related to virtual education, DPI receive approval for the proposed rules from TEACH, WTCS and DOA.
10. **Bilingual/Bicultural Education:** Earmark \$1.0 million in the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (cc), *Bilingual-bicultural education aids*, in FY03 and thereafter for grants to school districts to develop "dual-immersion" bilingual education programs.
11. **Bilingual/Bicultural Education eligibility requirements:** Districts that meet the pupil count thresholds specified under s. 115.97 are required to establish a bilingual-bicultural education program for those pupils. A bilingual teacher, (also under s. 115.97), must teach these programs. For programs designed to serve pupils in the elementary grades, repeal the requirement that a school board hire a bilingual teacher.
12. **MPCP Eligibility Criteria:** S. 119.23 (2) (a) 1 specifies that to be eligible to participate in the MPCP a child must be a member of a family that has a total income that does not exceed 175% of federal poverty level. Increase the threshold to 185% and provide that once a pupil attends a private school under the program, they remain eligible in subsequent years.
13. **St. Thomas More MPCP eligibility:** Under current law only schools that are located within the City of Milwaukee are eligible to participate in the MPCP. Allow a school to participate in the program if the school grounds upon which the school is sited is located in whole or in part in the City of Milwaukee.

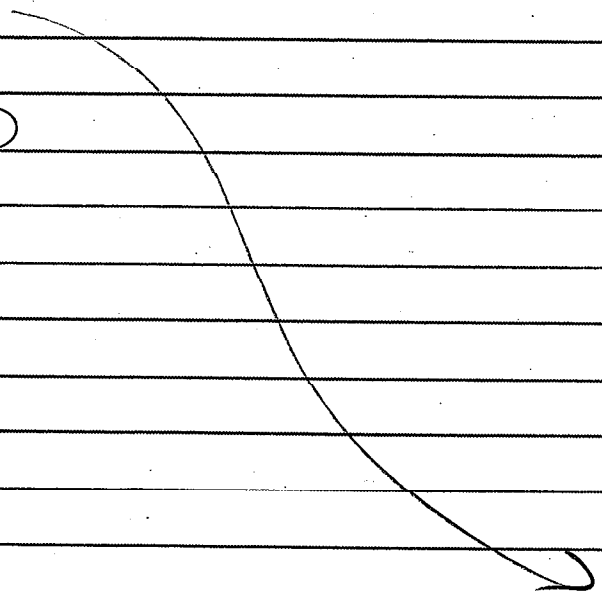

13 (c) Of the amount appropriated to the department of public instruction under
14 section 20.255 (1) (a) of the statutes in the 2002–03 fiscal year, the department shall
15 allocate \$700,000 for the purpose of contracting with school districts for the services
16 of licensed teachers under section 115.385 (3) of the statutes, as created by this act.
17 The department of public instruction may not encumber or expend the money so
18 allocated unless the secretary of administration determines that the reorganization
19 plan under paragraph (a) has been implemented.
