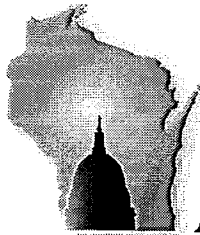

DRAFTING INSTRUCTIONS

Substance Abuse Treatment Grants

Background

Under s. 46.48(30) the Department of Health and Family Services distributes grants on a competitive basis to counties and nonprofit organizations for the provision of alcohol and other drug abuse treatment services in counties with a population of 500,000 or more. The department may distribute these grants only to the extent that the distribution meets the maintenance of effort requirement under the federal temporary assistance for needy families program.

Requested Change

1. Amend s. 46.48(30) to remove the provision that grants are to be distributed in a county with a population of 500,000 or more.
2. Amend s. 20.435(7)(bc) to provide that funds not expended by June 30 of each fiscal year are to be transferred to s. 20.445(3)(dz).
