I'm forwarding statutory language requests based on Governor's recommendations:

1. ^{JK} Provide \$7.0 million from the Shared Revenue Program to establish two recycling challenge grant programs
2. The two challenge grant programs will be administered by the Department of Commerce.
3. Earmark \$5.0 million each year to provide one-time grants to encourage local governments to establish regional recycling programs.
4. ^{RCT} Require DNR to develop a proposal, for inclusion in the 2003-2005 biennial budget, to revise the municipal recycling grant formula to allow consideration of regional recycling grants.
5. Earmark \$2.0 million ^{waste?} each year to provide grants to local governments to implement innovative organic materials management strategies. Grants should be competitive ^{GPR} based on thoroughness, effectiveness, and viability of the strategy.
6. Require the Recycling Market Development Board to work with municipalities to develop viable markets for the reuse of their organic materials. ^{waste?} 560.031
7. Provide Commerce with the authority to make rules to implement both challenge grant programs.
