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

Subject: New appropriation for the Department of Workforce Development

This is a statutory language request for a new appropriation in s. 20.445(1). The appropriation should be titled "*Work Permit System and Fee*" and it should be established as a program revenue continuing appropriation. The purpose of the appropriation is to collect fees charged under s. 103.805(1) for the development and maintenance of an automated work permit system and other operational expenses of the department's Equal Rights Division.

In addition, please modify the language currently under s. 103.805(1). The department should be given the authority to charge a \$7.50 fee for issuance of work permits. The office issuing the permit may retain \$2.50 of the fee and forward the remaining \$5.00 to the department. The department should deposit \$2.50 of the fee into the general fund and retain \$2.50 for the purposes described above.

EMPLOYMENT

Under current law, DWD may fix and collect a reasonable fee for issuing child labor permits, street trade permits, and certificates of age for minors. DWD has fixed that fee by rule at \$5.00, ~~50%~~ of which may be retained by the permit officer and ~~50%~~ of which must be forwarded to DWD. This bill increases that fee to \$7.50 and requires a permit officer who is not employed by DWD to forward \$5.00 of that fee, and a permit officer who is employed by DWD to forward the entirety of that fee, to DWD, which must deposit that amount forwarded in the general fund and credit \$2.50 of that amount forwarded to an appropriation account created by the bill to pay for the expenses of providing an automated child labor permit system and for other operational expenses of the division of equal rights in DWD.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

2 SECTION 1. 20.445 (1) (j) of the statutes is created to read:

Josh:

Ordinarily a local school board or some other local official such as the county clerk issues work permits. The statutes, however, also authorize DWD to issue work permits directly. Although DWD rarely issues work permits in practice, that scenario is possible under the statutes. Accordingly, this draft covers that scenario by requiring a DWD employee who issues a work permit to forward the entire amount of the fee to DWD, which must deposit that entire amount in the general fund and credit \$2.50 of that amount to the appropriation created by this draft. ✓
