Subject: New appropriations for the Governor's Work-based Learning Board

This is a statutory language request to create two new appropriations in DWD's Chapter 20. Both appropriations will be in s. 20.445(7). One should be a program revenue-federal continuing appropriation, similar to s. 20.445(1)(m). The second appropriation should be a program revenue continuing auxiliary services appropriation, similar to s. 20.445(1)(ga).

In addition, there should be language included under s. 106.13 related to the auxiliary services appropriations. This language should allow the Board to establish a schedule of fees for publications provided by the Board and require that these fees must not exceed the actual cost of providing the publications.
