Subject: Budget Draft for UW System

Create statutory provision that provides the Board with the authority to grant remission of resident fees to a Wisconsin resident student who is declared the "champion" of the Wisconsin State Science Fair.

NOTE: the "Wisconsin State Science Fair" is something that is currently in the planning stages - the first Wisconsin State Science Fair is scheduled for the spring of 2002. Thus, the first year that the remission could be in effect would for the 2002-03 academic year.

I have borrowed language from materials the UW has provided me for the details:

"State Science Fair Champion" means the annual designee of the Wisconsin Science Education Foundation (the director of the Wisconsin State Science Fair).

A fee remission would be granted to a Wisconsin resident who is declared the champion (by the WSEF). The fee remission would remain in effect until completion of a sufficient number of credits to be awarded a bachelor's degree in the student's major field of study, except that a student must be in good academic standing to receive the remission for the next semester and may not receive a remission for more than 5 consecutive years. In addition, upon completion of a bachelor's degree, the student shall be eligible to receive a fee remission for a science related graduate program. The student must be in good academic standing to receive the remission for the next semester and may not receive a remission for more than 2 consecutive years.

We would like this structured so that the UW absorbs the cost of the remissions from tuition/fees charged to other students [as opposed to funding if from the GPR appropriation for Fee remissions under s.20.285 (1)(bm)].

It has occurred to me that this might be problematic to draft, since the Wisconsin State Science Fair doesn't yet exist - but I've been asked to forward this to you for drafting.

Under current law, the UW System board of regents (board) must remit resident, undergraduate tuition for children or spouses of certain persons, such as police officers, who are killed in the line of duty. This bill directs the board to remit the resident, undergraduate tuition of the winner of the Wisconsin State Science Fair for up to five consecutive years. A winner who receives the fee remission, remains in good academic standing, and completes a bachelor's degree is ~~eligible for two years~~ of fee remission for a science-related graduate program.

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36.27 (3r) FEE REMISSION; OTHER. Beginning in the 2002-03 academic year, the board shall grant full remission of resident undergraduate student who is enrolled in a bachelor's degree program and who is designated the annual winner of the Wisconsin State Science Fair by the Wisconsin Science Education Foundation. The fee remission remains in effect until completion of a sufficient number of credits to be awarded a bachelor's degree in a science-related field of study, except that a student must be in good academic standing to receive the remission for the next semester and may not receive a remission for more than 5 consecutive years. Upon completion of the student's bachelor's degree, the board shall grant the student a fee remission for a science-related graduate program. The graduate fee remission remains in effect for 2 consecutive years, except that a student must be in good academic standing to receive the remission for the next semester.
