

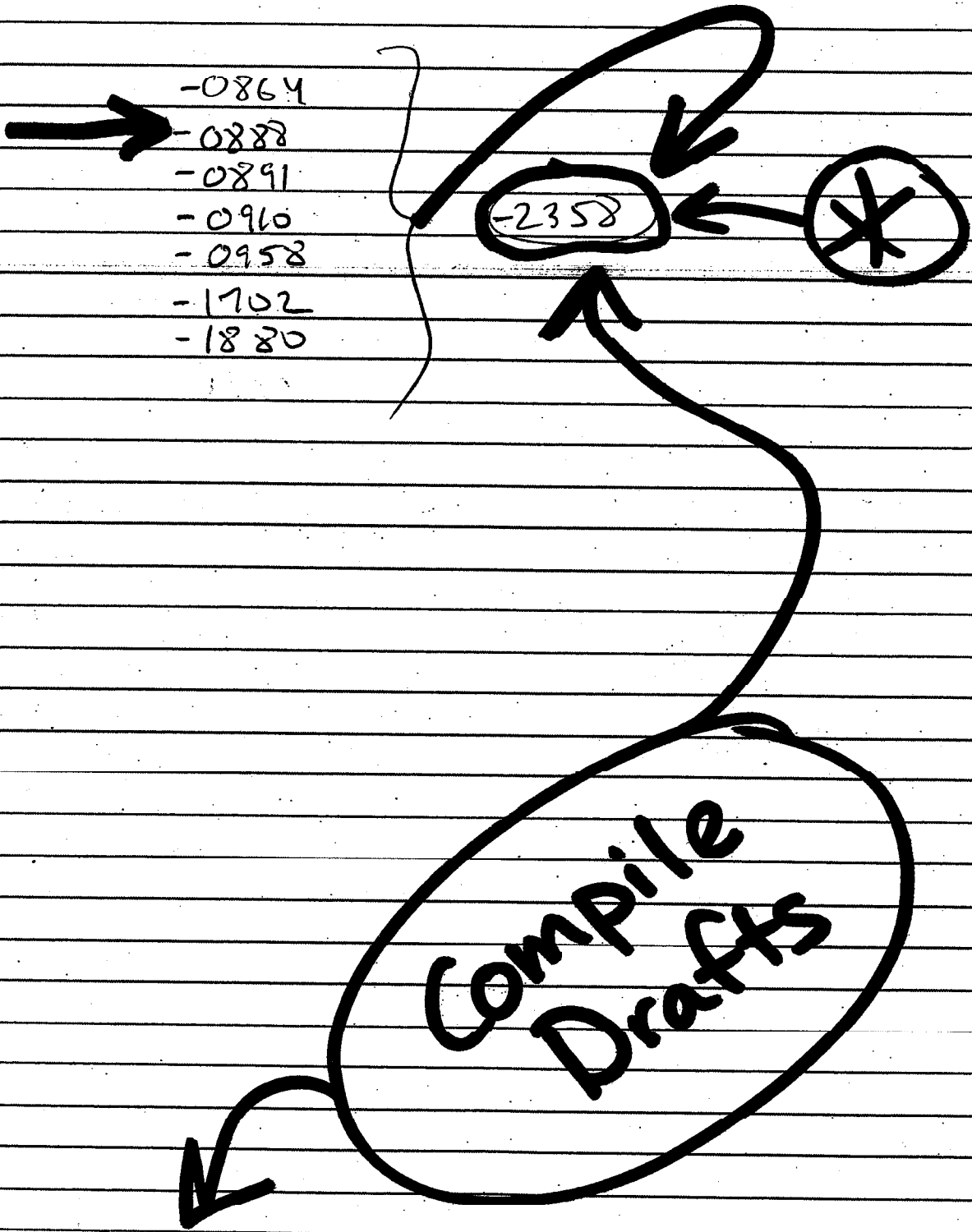





Brief Description of Intent: To amend ss. 118.30 (1m) (a) 1. and 2., 118.30 (1m) (am) 1. and 2., and 118.30 (1r) (a) 1. and 2. to change "2 opportunities" to "1 opportunity." The 4th and 8th grade knowledge and concept examinations are no longer intended to be "high stakes" examinations, i.e., the sole determining factor in making decisions to promote pupils to 5th and 9th grades. Other factors will also be considered in making promotion decisions. Reducing test administrations will reduce state and local administration-related costs.
