7 of the project.

9 biennium, from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (nx) of the statutes, the
10 department of transportation shall award a grant to the village of Holmen for the

20 from the appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (fr) of the statutes, as affected by this

15 this paragraph, the department of transportation shall consult with the department
16 of electronic government, as created by this act. The department of transportation
17 shall include in the report recommendations concerning the potential benefits of
18 coordinating data processing resource planning among other state agencies. By the
19 date specified by the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance for submission
20 of requests for consideration at the 4th quarterly meeting of the committee for the
21 2001–02 fiscal year, the department shall submit the report to the committee for
22 review and approval under section 13.10 of the statutes.

23 (b) Notwithstanding section 16.50 (1) of the statutes, as affected by this act, and

3 transportation shall submit a request for the transfer of moneys from the
4 appropriations under section 20.395 (3) (cq), (cv), and (cx) of the statutes, as affected

6 statutes, as created by this act, to allocate funds for reconstruction of the southeast

4 University of Wisconsin System, the president of the board of regents of the
5 University of Wisconsin System, the president of the technical college system board,
6 and the director of the technical college system shall submit reports no later than
7 October 15, 2001, April 15, 2002, October 15, 2002, and April 15, 2003, to the
8 education committees of the assembly and the senate on all of the following:

24 loans purchased under section 45.79 (5) (a) 10. of the statutes, as created by this act.

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1 (b) *Funding.* The secretary of administration may not direct that moneys
2 appropriated to the department of veterans affairs under section 20.485 (3) (wd),
3 (wg), and (wp) of the statutes, as created by this act, be encumbered or expended until
4 after the plan developed under paragraph (a) is completed.

5 (c) *Escrow payments.* Notwithstanding section 45.79 (5) (a) of the statutes, as
6 affected by this act, the department of veterans affairs may not hold monthly escrow
7 payments made by borrowers until after the plan developed under paragraph (a) is
8 completed.

22 the committee. The number of authorized positions for mobile claims officers that
23 are proposed by the department and approved by the committee under this
24 paragraph may not exceed the limits under section 45.35 (4) (d) of the statutes, as
25 created by this act.

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1 (b) The department of veterans affairs, in consultation with Wisconsin
2 veterans service organizations, county veterans' service officer organizations, and
3 county veterans' service officers, shall study whether additional regional
4 coordinators are needed to provide claim and benefit assistance to veterans located
5 outside the department's southeastern regional service area. If the department and
6 the Wisconsin veterans service organizations, county veterans' service officer
7 organizations, and county veterans' service officers with which the department
8 consults determine that additional regional coordinators are needed, the
9 department shall submit a proposal to the joint committee on finance to increase the
10 number of authorized positions in the department for regional coordinators. If the
11 cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the secretary of veterans affairs within
12 14 working days after receiving the proposal that the cochairpersons have scheduled
13 a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the proposal, the number of authorized
14 positions are increased by the number proposed. If, within 14 working days after
15 receiving the proposal, the cochairpersons notify the secretary of veterans affairs
16 that the cochairpersons have scheduled a meeting for the purpose of reviewing the
17 proposal, the number of authorized positions may be increased only as approved by
18 the committee. The number of authorized positions for regional coordinators that
19 are proposed by the department and approved by the committee under this

16 (a) *Position transfer.*

17 1. On the effective date of this subdivision, the authorized FTE positions for the
18 department of workforce development, funded from the appropriation under section
19 20.445 (1) (kc) of the statutes, are decreased by 1.0 PR-S position having
20 responsibility for small projects requiring the services of an electrician.

21 2. On the effective date of this subdivision, the authorized FTE positions for the
22 department of administration, funded from the appropriation under section 20.505
23 (5) (ka) of the statutes, as affected by this act, are increased by 1.0 PR-S position
24 having responsibility for small projects requiring the services of an electrician.

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1 3. On the effective date of this subdivision, the incumbent employee holding the
2 position specified in subdivision 1. is transferred to the department of
3 administration.

4 (b) *Employee status.* The employee transferred under paragraph (a) 3. shall
5 have all the same rights and the same statutes under subchapter V of chapter 111
6 and chapter 230 of the statutes in the department of workforce development
7 immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4) of the statutes,
8 if the employee so transferred has attained permanent status in class, that employee
9 is not required to serve a probationary period.
