12 **DEDUCTIBLE.** The department of natural resources shall identify any award made
13 under section 292.65 of the statutes using the deductible under section 292.65 (8) (e)
14 3., 1999 stats., and recalculate the award using the deductible under section 292.65
15 (8) (e) of the statutes, as affected by this act. Before July 1, 2002, the department
16 shall pay to the recipient the difference between the amount of the original award
17 and the amount as recalculated under this subsection.

18 ***b0278/1.3* (1x) APPLICABILITY OF HIGH-CAPACITY WELL REQUIREMENTS.** The
19 treatment of section 281.17 (1) (c) of the statutes applies to an approval issued by the
20 department of natural resources under section 281.17 of the statutes on or after
21 September 1, 2000. The department of natural resources shall modify an approval
22 issued by the department of natural resources under section 281.17 of the statutes
23 on or after September 1, 2000, in order to incorporate into the approval the condition

8 fiscal biennium, the department of natural resources shall provide a grant from the

6 shall provide to the city of Oconto the amount that is necessary for the dredging of
7 a portion of the Oconto River, in an amount not to exceed \$386,000. The city of Oconto
8 need not contribute any moneys to match the amount provided from the

8 defender board, in consultation with the director of state courts and the Wisconsin
9 District Attorneys Association, shall develop alternative charging and sentencing
10 options for misdemeanor crimes in order to divert misdemeanor offenders from
11 imprisonment, and shall submit a proposal describing the recommended options to
12 the secretary of administration by July 1, 2002. The proposal shall address, among
13 other topics, alternative charging and sentencing options for nonviolent crimes
14 against property. If the secretary of administration approves the proposal, he or she
15 shall submit the proposal to the joint committee on finance. If the cochairpersons of

20 following applies:

21 (a) *Assets and liabilities.* The assets and liabilities of the public service
22 commission primarily related to the regulation of water and sewer service provided
23 to manufactured home parks, as determined by the secretary of administration, shall
24 become the assets and liabilities of the department of commerce.

1 (b) *Tangible personal property.* All tangible personal property, including
2 records, of the public service commission primarily related to the regulation of water

13 that are in effect on the effective date of this paragraph and that are primarily related
14 to the regulation of water and sewer service provided to manufactured home parks,
15 as determined by the secretary of administration, remain in effect until their
16 specified expiration date or until amended or repealed by the department of
17 commerce. All orders issued by the public service commission that are in effect on
18 the effective date of this paragraph and that are primarily related to the regulation
19 of water and sewer service provided to manufactured home parks, as determined by
20 the secretary of administration, remain in effect until their specified expiration date
21 or until modified or rescinded by the department of commerce.

22 (e) *Pending matters.* Any matter pending with the public service commission
23 on the effective date of this paragraph and that is primarily related to the regulation
24 of water and sewer service provided to manufactured home parks, as determined by
25 the secretary of administration, is transferred to the department of commerce and

1 all materials submitted to or actions taken by the public service commission with
2 respect to the pending matter are considered as having been submitted to or taken
3 by the department of commerce.

15 for the examining physician or optometrist to indicate which of the required
16 elements of the examination were performed and whether follow-up care is
17 recommended.

18 (b) By May 31, 2002, the department of regulation and licensing shall
19 distribute the form to school districts and charter schools as provided under section

25 and 71.25 (6) (e) of the statutes, as created by this act, to the legislative council staff

1 under section 227.15 (1) of the statutes no later than the first day of the 4th month
2 beginning after the effective date of this subsection.

3 ***b0469/2.1*** (2e) SHARED REVENUE POPULATION ADJUSTMENT.

4 (a) Notwithstanding section 79.005 (2) of the statutes, the population used for
5 purposes of determining 2001 shared revenue payments under section 79.03 of the
6 statutes, ~~as affected by this act,~~ and 2001 county mandate relief payments under
7 section 79.058 of the statutes shall be the population determined by the department
8 of administration under section 16.96 of the statutes for the statements provided to

20 police and the incumbents in those positions, as determined by the secretary of
21 administration, are transferred to the department of administration.

22 (b) Employees transferred under paragraph (a) have all the rights and the
23 same status under subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the statutes in the
24 department of administration that they enjoyed in the state fair park board
25 immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4) of the statutes,

1 no employee so transferred who has attained permanent status in class is required
2 to serve a probationary period.

1 ***b0663/2.2*** (1mk) GRANT FOR MOVING HISTORIC HOME. From the appropriation
2 under section 20.380 (1) (b) of the statutes, as affected by this act, the department
3 of tourism shall provide a grant of \$35,000 in fiscal year 2001–02 to the New Berlin
4 Historical Society for costs associated with moving the Theodora Winton Youmans
5 home to the New Berlin historic park. The department of tourism shall enter into
6 an agreement with the New Berlin Historical Society that specifies the uses for the
7 grant proceeds and reporting and auditing requirements.

9 ***-0415/P1*** (2) POSITION AUTHORIZATION; EMPLOYEE TRANSFER.

10 (a) The authorized FTE positions for the department of transportation are
11 decreased by 1.0 SEG position for the performance of duties primarily related to
12 printing services.

13 (b) On the effective date of this paragraph, 1.0 FTE position in the department
14 of transportation performing duties primarily related to printing services and the
15 incumbent employee holding that position, as determined by the secretary of
16 administration, are transferred to the department of administration. The employee
17 transferred under this paragraph has all the rights and the same status under
18 subchapter V of chapter 111 and chapter 230 of the statutes in the department of
19 administration that the employee enjoyed in the department of transportation
20 immediately before the transfer. Notwithstanding section 230.28 (4) of the statutes,
21 no employee so transferred who has attained permanent status in class is required
22 to serve a probationary period.

23 ***-0832/5.9152*** (3) AIRPORT FINANCING COMMITTEE. There is created an airport
24 financing committee consisting of members appointed by the governor. The governor
25 shall appoint members representing the department of transportation, the

1 department of commerce, airport managers, airlines serving this state, the general
2 aviation community, the people of this state, and private businesses having an
3 interest in transportation policy and financing. The committee shall select its
4 officers and the person appointed chairperson shall call the committee's first
5 meeting. The committee shall review and evaluate this state's airport system needs
6 and the current system of funding those needs and shall recommend changes, if any,
7 to better meet those needs. The committee shall evaluate, among other things:
8 aircraft registration fees; aviation fuel taxes and fees; allocation of sales tax receipts
9 from the sale of aircraft, parts, and services; and the allocation of other moneys for
10 airport financing. The committee's recommendations, if any, should, if enacted,
11 generate revenue in amounts equal to or greater than the sum of moneys
12 appropriated for aeronautical activities in fiscal year 2002. Not later than December
13 31, 2002, the committee shall submit a report containing the committee's evaluation,
14 findings, and recommendations to the governor, and to the legislature in the manner
15 provided under section 13.172 (2) of the statutes.

16 ***b0515/1.1*** (3d) PORT ARTHUR ROAD EXTENSION IN CITY OF LADYSMITH. From the
17 appropriation under section 20.395 (2) (fq) of the statutes, as created by this act, the
18 department of transportation shall allocate \$200,000 or 80% of the cost of the project,
19 whichever is less, in the 2001–03 fiscal biennium to fund a project to close a portion
20 of College Avenue in the city of Ladysmith and to extend Port Arthur Road east to
21 STH 27 in the city of Ladysmith, if the city of Ladysmith provides a local contribution
22 toward the costs of the project in an amount equal to at least 20% of the cost of the
23 project.
