SOS Children's Villages

Agency: Building Commission and DHFS

CN6556

Description: Authorize the Building Commission to contract public debt in the amount of up to \$550,000 (\$225,000 annually in 2001-02 and 2002-03) toward the construction of the SOS Children's Villages of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Chapter. Project is not to be enumerated unless DOA approves the plan submitted by SOS Children's Villages. Before approving any state funds, the Building Commission would be required to determine that the SOS Children's Villages of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Chapter has secured additional funding of at least \$3.27 Million from non state donations for the purpose of constructing the Children's Village. Further, specify that if the Building Commission makes a grant to the SOS Children's Villages of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Chapter, and if, for any reason, the facility that is constructed with funds from the grant is not used as a children's village, the state would retain an ownership interest equal to the amount of the state's grant.

Funds are to be equally divided over the two years of the 2001-2003 biennial budget, with the first year funding to be used for Phase I of the SOS Children's Village capital program and the second year funding to be used for Phase II of the SOS Children's Village capital program. In addition, provide \$75,000 to initially fund the parent training program.
