77.51 (8) "Newspaper" means those publications which that are commonly understood to be newspapers and which that are printed and distributed periodically at daily, weekly, or other short intervals for the dissemination of current news and information of a general character and of a general interest to the public. In addition, any publication which qualifies that is eligible for compensation or a fee as a newspaper under s. 985.03 (1) is a newspaper. "Newspaper" also includes

advertising supplements if they are printed by a newspaper and distributed as a component part of one of that newspaper's publications or if they are printed by a newspaper or a commercial printer and sold to a newspaper for inclusion in publications of that newspaper. The definition includes a daily newspaper published in a county having a population of 500,000 or more, devoted principally to business news and publishing of records, which has been designated by the courts of record of the county for publication of legal notices for a period of 6 months or more.

SECTION 2. 985.03 (1) (a) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

985.03 (1) (a) (intro.) No Except as provided in par. (am), no publisher of any newspaper in this state shall be awarded or be entitled to any compensation or fee for the publishing of any legal notice unless, for at least 2 of the 5 years immediately before the date of the notice publication, the newspaper has been published regularly and continuously in the city, village, or town where published, and has had a bona fide paid circulation:
