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


Possible revenue sources to fund Motion#1407 and Motion #1406:

[Re: LFB Paper #192, Alternative 1 and Motion #1581]

CN5508

Motion #1407 and Motion #1406 are two of Senator Moore's high priorities relating to alternatives to incarceration. Both were proposed in Senator Moore's July 29, 2000 letter to Governor Thompson proposing seven alternatives to incarceration with high cost-saving potential after implementation.

Federal Bryne funding and matching penalty assessment revenue were the source of funds identified by Senator Moore in this July 29, 2000 letter. Given the action of the Committee relating to LFB Paper #192 and Motion #1581, funding for the following programs proposed by the Governor was maintained:

**Local and 15% match:**

- Ecstasy Awareness and Enforcement Grants (new) \$250,000 annually
- Special Projects (new) \$210,000 annually

**State and 25% match:**

- Department of Corrections 5<sup>th</sup> Offense OWI program \$464,700 annually  
(base created in 1999-2001 + standard budget adjustments)
- 
- \$924,700 annually

Funding could be reduced or deleted from these programs in order to fund Motion #1407 and Motion #1406.

Motion:

Move to direct the Office of Justice Assistance (OJA) to allocate \$150,000 annually in federal Byrne and matching penalty assessment--local funds to provide one-time community justice center grants of up to \$50,000 to each grantee/consortium for the purpose of planning a community justice centers program. Direct OJA to: (a) provide a one-time grant of \$50,000 to the Community Justice Center in Milwaukee; (b) award community justice center grants only to consortiums of local government and community-based organizations; and (c) give priority to localities with high crime rates and jail overcrowding when awarding community justice center grants. Direct OJA to establish: (a) the procedures for and to administer the grant program; and (b) the criteria for determining what consortiums of local government and community-based organizations qualify as community justice centers.

We would like to accomplish the following regarding these two CNS.

Roll 5503 into 5502, so we are just dealing with one amendment here (5502).

In 5502, delete the following amounts of Federal Byrne funding and matching penalty assessment revenue from the following programs:

- \$210,000 annually from "Special Projects"
- \$380,000 from 02-03 appropriation to the "Misdemeanor Diversion Program"

This should provide the necessary funds for the following programs:

- Per motion 1406, \$150,000 annually in federal Byrne and matching penalty assessment-local funds for the "Community Justice Center Grants"
- Per motion 1407, \$250,000 annually in federal Byrne and matching penalty assessment-local funds for the "Pretrial Intoxicated Driver Intervention Program"

CAUCUS SENATE AMENDMENT

TO SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,

TO 2001 SENATE BILL 55

D-Note

1 At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

2 1. Page 252, line 2: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2001-02 by  
3 \$47,500 and increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2002-03 by \$47,500 for the  
4 purpose of funding pretrial intoxicated driver intervention grants and community  
5 justice center planning grants.

6 2. Page 252, line 6: decrease the dollar amount for fiscal year 2002-03 by  
7 \$95,000 for the purpose for which the appropriation is made.

8 3. Page 1295, line 7: delete "\$1,864,700" and substitute "\$1,484,700".

9 4. Page 1298, line 24: after that line insert:



① “(21) COMMUNITY JUSTICE CENTER GRANTS. (a) From the appropriation accounts  
 2 under section 20.505 (6) (kp) of the statutes and section 20.505 (6) (p) of the statutes,  
 3 as affected by this act, the office of justice assistance shall allocate \$150,000 in fiscal  
 4 year 2001–02 and \$150,000 in fiscal year 2002–03 in grants to consortiums  
 5 consisting of local government agencies and community–based organizations for  
 6 planning community justice center programs. The office of justice assistance shall  
 7 establish eligibility criteria for grants under this subsection, including specification  
 8 of the types of agencies and organizations that may receive grants. The maximum  
 9 amount that the office may award any single consortium under this subsection is a  
 10 one–time grant of \$50,000. The office of justice assistance shall establish guidelines  
 11 for administering the grant program under this subsection, including guidelines for  
 12 evaluating and selecting grant recipients. The office shall give priority for receipt  
 13 of funds under this subsection to consortiums that serve localities in which the  
 14 incidence of crime is high relative to other localities in the state and to localities for  
 15 which the ratio of persons placed at the county jail to the capacity of the jail is high  
 16 relative to other localities in the state.

17 (b) From the appropriation accounts to the office of justice assistance under  
 18 section 20.505 (6) (kp) of the statutes and section 20.505 (6) (p) of the statutes, as  
 19 affected by this act, the office of justice assistance shall allocate \$50,000 of the  
 20 amount available for grants for planning community justice center programs under  
 21 paragraph (a) to the community justice center in Milwaukee in fiscal year 2001–02.”.

Please note that because this amendment directs the office of justice assistance to allocate \$50,000 to a specific community justice center in Milwaukee it may be a private bill. Article IV, section 18, of the Wisconsin Constitution prohibits any private bill from embracing more than one subject. If enacted as part of the budget bill, this amendment may be subject to a challenge that it violates the state constitution and may be invalidated.
