

The request specifies that the department of transportation (DOT) must grant or deny a permit for the trimming or removal of vegetation within 30 days of application for the permit. Accordingly, the attached draft requires DOT to issue permits for the trimming or removal of vegetation in highway rights—of—way, and requires DOT to promulgate rules to administer the permit process. Under the attached draft, permits are valid for one year from the date of issuance and must specify the vegetation or portion of the highway right—of—way to which the permit applies. Is this consistent with your intent?

The request does not specify whether the amendment is intended to apply only to businesses located adjacent to the highway right—of—way or also to other businesses, and if the latter how far of a distance from the highway may these businesses be located? The attached draft assumes the businesses must be located adjacent to the highway right—of—way.

While the request does not include certain details necessary to make the vegetation management program workable, the draft's provision of rule-making authority to DOT allows DOT flexibility in addressing these details to make the program administratively practical.

I note that DOT is currently required to increase the amount of vegetation in state trunk highway rights—of—way. See s. 84.01 (29), stats. Under DOT's Roadside Vegetation Management program, Trans ch. 280, Wis. Adm. Code, DOT undertakes the planting of trees and other actions to enhance roadside aesthetics along state trunk highways. The attached draft may allow private persons to remove vegetation added to state trunk highways at state expense, but only if the criteria of the statute are met. If the criteria are not met, DOT should not issue a permit allowing removal of the vegetation. In addition, to the extent the attached draft contravenes the federal Highway Beautification Act, it may jeopardize federal highway aid.

Private persons can be expected to do their trimming of state—owned trees located in highway rights—of—way during the late spring and summer, when foliage is at its peak and views are most obstructed, and when trimming is most unhealthy for the trees. Do you want to require private persons to be responsible for compensation for disease or injury to trees or vegetation resulting from improper trimming or treatment?

There are changes needed in this draft.

Regarding the drafters note, first paragraph, the only thing needed is the 30 days. The DOT currently has the authority to issue permits but there isn't a guideline by when they have to do it. We do not want the DOT to promulgate rules to administer the permit process because they already have internal guidelines and manuals in place already.

Second paragraph. The amendment is inteded to apply only to businesses located adjacent to the highway right of way, NOT to other businesses.

Third paragraph. We do not need details to make the vegetation program workable, because there are already details that exist internally within the department.

Fourth paragraph. Fine.

Fifth paragraph. We DO NOT want to require private persons to be responsible for compensation for disease or injury to trees or vegetation resulting from improper trimming or treatment. There are already DOT guidlines for this.

Items in the draft:

Page 2, line 4. after "the highway right-of-way" delete "or in any business advertised on a sign". We want "anyone who owns a sign" to be put in place of that language (whatever the legal jargon may be).

Page 2, lines 23 and 24. Delete these lines.

Page 3, lines 1 and 2. Delete these lines. The department already has existing guidelines.
