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84.0131 Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Rehabilitation Program (1) In this section "southeastern Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation project" means any rehabilitation or reconstruction project on a multi-lane, fully accessed controlled freeway located in Kenosha, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, Walworth, Washington or Walworth counties, including additional lanes provided as part of a reconstruction project.

(2) Subject to s. 86.255, all southeastern Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation projects shall be funded from appropriations under s. 20.395 (3) (ix). (3) Notwithstanding any provision, southeastern Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation projects are not major highway projects as defined in s. 84.013 (1) (a).20.395 (3) (ix) Southeastern Wisconsin Freeway Reconstruction Program. As a continuing appropriation, the amounts in the schedule for the southeastern Wisconsin freeway rehabilitation program under s. 84.0131. DOT is required to submit a Section. 13.10 to Joint Finance moving reconstruction projects and funding to the newly created S.E. Wisconsin Regional Freeway Appropriations. However, the language maintains that only reconstruction projects can be moved. DTIMBHPS would like to move all freeway related projects, e.g. resurfacing, reconstruction, etc. in order to provide greater project and financing flexibility. Fiscal Bureau identified only 4 projects and approximately \$35 million that would meet the definition of reconstruction. DTIM staff and WTBA have discussed the issue and have reached agreement on the changes necessary regarding the language creating the SE program.

Provision #34, Miss & Run

Statement of Intent:

Extend the duties of a motorist involved in an accident to a motorist who primarily causes, but whose vehicle is not physically involved in an accident and provide penalties. (AB 63, as amended & passed by the assembly)

Provision #35, Disclosure of info to the Selective Service System

Statement of Intent:

Requires the Dot to notify any male (18-26 years old) who applies for any driver's license, permit, or ID card that his application will be forwarded to the selective service system for the purpose of registration with the selective service system AND requires DOT to forward the application of any said male to the selective service system for the purpose of selective service registration.

Provision #36, Locations of Rest Areas


Statement of Intent:

Prohibits locating a rest area within 5 miles of an exit with existing services, exempting rest areas within five miles of a border. The provision also exempts the Belmont rest area located in Lafayette County. Savings would be used to fund rest stops closed or proposed to be closed by the DOT in areas where other facilities are not available.



At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

1. Page 865, line 20: after that line insert:

SECTION 2307g. 84.04 (4) of the statutes is created to read:

84.04 (4) Notwithstanding sub. (2), after the effective date of this subsection [revisor inserts date], the department may not construct any rest area along or in close proximity with a state trunk highway at a location that is within a radius of 5 miles from an exit from the highway that provides access to motorist services described under s. 86.195 (3). This subsection does not apply to any rest area/located no more than 5 miles from the border of this state or to any rest area that may be located near the village of Belmont in Lafayette County.".

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2. Page 1357, line : after that line insert:

encumbrances that the department of transportation does not make in the 2001-03 fiscal biennium as a result of the implementation of section 84.04 (4) of the statutes, as created by this act, shall be expended or encumbered by the department in the 2001-03 fiscal biennium to reopen previously closed rest areas or keep open rest areas proposed for closure in areas where other rest areas and motorist services described there section 86.195 (3) of the statutes are not available."

3. Page 1409, line : after that line insert:

"(5) HIGHWAY REST AREAS. The treatment of section 84.04 (4) of the statutes first applies to construction commenced on the effective date of this subsection.".
