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

Kettl Commission-related studies:

JTK

- **Shared Revenue Study:** Directs the Department of Revenue to study options for restructuring shared revenue and to encourage high-growth sectors of the economy and the creation of "high-quality" jobs in Wisconsin. The study is required to consider using up to 10 percent of the amount distributed to counties and municipalities under s. 79.03, Stats., relating to the distribution of shared revenue payments, to match local efforts to encourage creation of "high-quality" jobs in Wisconsin. The DOR is required to report the results of its study to the Secretary of the Department of Administration no later than January 1, 2003. The study assignment was expanded to include recommendations on how to incorporate "smart growth planning" into the shared revenue program. Study allowing town governments to freeze boundaries in exchange for shared revenue compensation.

- **Juvenile Justice System Study:** Directs a study on the costs of transferring operation of the juvenile justice system from the counties to the state. Requires the formation of a five-member commission including the Secretary of the Department of Administration, Department of Health and Family Services, the Secretary of Corrections, a representative of the Wisconsin Counties Association and a representative of Milwaukee County. Directs each county to develop a uniform chart of accounts beginning on January 1, 2002. Requires each county to report its revenues and expenditures related to operations of the juvenile justice programs in 2002 to DOA by March 15, 2003. Directs the commission to submit to the Legislature, on or before May 1, 2003, a recommendation in the form of legislation for the state's assumption of all or part of the operating costs of the juvenile justice system, effective January 1, 2004. Specify that the legislation includes the elimination of youth aids program and a reduction in payments under the county shared revenue and mandate relief programs.

1. Page 1332, line 3: after that line insert:

“(6~~7~~) JUVENILE JUSTICE SYSTEM STUDY.

(a) There is created a committee to study the costs of the state assuming from the counties[’] responsibility for the operation of the juvenile justice system. The committee shall consist of the secretary of administration or the secretary’s designee, the secretary of corrections or the secretary’s designee, the secretary of health and family[✓] services or the secretary’s designee, a representative of the Wisconsin Counties Association, and a representative of[✓] Milwaukee County, with the governor to appoint the chairperson of the committee.

1 (b) Beginning on January 1, 2002, each county shall adopt a uniform system of
2 accounts prescribed by the committee for the recording of all revenues and
3 expenditures relating to the operation of the juvenile justice system in the county.
4 By March 15, 2003, each county shall report those revenues and expenditures to the
5 committee.

6 (c) By May 1, 2003, the committee shall report its findings, conclusions, and
7 recommendations to the legislature in the manner provided in section 13.172 (2) of
8 the statutes and to the governor. The report shall include proposed legislation for
9 all of the following:

10 1. The assumption by the state of all or part of the operating costs of the juvenile
11 justice system, beginning on January 1, 2004.

12 2. The elimination of youth aids payments to counties under section 301.26 of
13 the statutes, as affected by this act, and a reduction in the amount of shared revenue
14 payments and mandate relief payments to counties under sections 79.03, 79.058,
15 79.06, and 79.08 of the statutes and under section 79.04 of the statutes, as affected
16 by this act, as a result of the state's assumption of the costs of operating the juvenile
17 justice system.”.
