Summary

This motion provides one time funding of \$185,000 PR in 2001-02 and \$500,000 PR in 2002-03 and 2.0 PR two-year project positions, beginning in 2001-02, to fund the statewide trauma system required under 1997 Wisconsin Act 154. These positions would include a trauma registrar and an injury education coordinator.

This motion provides that confidential injury data collected under the system would be used for performance improvements in the trauma care system, and be limited only to confidential review.

Extends the sunset date for the Statewide Trauma Advisory Council from July 1, 2002 to July 1, 2004.

Eliminates statutory requirement that JFC approve the Department's report on the statewide trauma system under section 13.10 of the statutes prior to the Department submitting rules to develop and implement the system.

Fiscal Impact

Provides 2.0 PR project positions and \$185,000 PR in 2001-02 and \$500,000 PR in 2002-03 for the following: (a) \$60,000 in 2001-02 and \$80,000 in 2002-03 for a trauma registrar; (b) \$60,000 in 2001-02 and \$80,000 in 2002-03 for an injury education coordinator; (c) \$40,000 in 2001-02 for a consultant to develop information systems for the trauma system; (d) \$25,000 in 2001-02 and \$50,000 in 2002-03 for meeting expenses for the regional advisory trauma councils; and (e) \$290,000 in 2002-03 for grants to regional advisory trauma councils.

The Department of Transportation will be required to make a grant to DHFS of these amounts from federal grant moneys DOT receives under the state and community highway safety grant program.

SECTION 1. 146.95 of the statutes is created to read: 146.95 Patient visitation. (1) DEFINITIONS. In this section:

- (a) "Health care provider" has the meaning given in s. 155.01 (7)
- (b) "Inpatient health care facility" has the meaning given in s. 252.14 (1) (d).

- 2. The inpatient health care facility or a health care provider determines that the presence of the person would endanger the health or safety of the patient.
- 3. The inpatient health care facility determines that the presence of the person would interfere with the primary operations of the inpatient health care facility.
- 4. The patient has subsequently expressed in writing to a health care provider at the inpatient health care facility that the patient no longer wishes to visit with the person. Unless subd. 2. applies, an inpatient health care facility may not under this subdivision deny visitation to the person based on a claim by someone other than a health care provider that the patient has orally expressed that the patient no longer wishes to visit with that person.



The conflict in years will create more trouble than a review on the more regular schedule of 3 years will cause.

Page 3, Lines 14 & 15: The Budget Amendment summary (# 303) and the actual language don't match. It would appear the dates on lines 14 & 15 should be changed from 2002 to 2001 and from 2004 to 2003. Otherwise, this starts in the middle of the the upcoming biennium and ends in the middle of the next biennium.???
