B. Bureau of Air Management — Fees and Staffing

- 1. In order to address current backlog of air emissions applications, transfer 2.0 PR FTE from DNR Cooperative Environmental Assistance to 2.0 PR FTE DNR Air Management
- 2. In addition, adopt Joint Finance to approve the Governor's recommendation and (a) delete \$251,000 PR annually associated with the four Air and Waste Division positions that would be deleted by the Governor; and (b) delete an additional \$458,600 PR annually and 8.0 PR positions in the Air and Waste Division in order to maintain air emissions funded expenditures within existing fee revenues.

B. Funding Notices of Discharge (NOD) Outside the Targeted Runoff Management (TRM) Grant Process

Add a new subsection to s. 281.65, subsection (4d), which states:

If the department issues a notice of discharge (NOD) under Ch. 283 to an animal feeding operation, the department shall provide financial assistance of at least 70% of the installation costs for corrective measures needed to address the unacceptable practices identified in the notice of discharge. Greater than 70% may be paid in cases of financial hardship as provided by the Department in administrative rule. Financial assistance for the corrective measures may be paid to a governmental unit for disbursement to a landowner if funds from appropriation s. 20.866 (2) (te) are used or may be paid directly to the owner of the animal feeding operation if segregated or general purpose revenue funds are used (see 2000 LRB Draft 0371/1).

Explanatory note – 1999 Act 9 moved the responsibility for paying for NOD's from DATCP to DNR. Funds were transferred and DATCP's authority to issue funds was

repealed, but that authority was not recreated for DNR. This provision gives DNR authority to disburse funds.

D. Combined Sewer Bypasses

Intentional diversions of untreated waste streams from any portion of a treatment facility are prohibited unless (1) the bypass does not cause effluent to exceed limits, and (2) the bypass was unavoidable to prevent loss of life, personal injury, or severe property damage, and (3) there was no feasible alternatives, and the proper notification was submitted.

In addition, require a joint legislative council study on the overall issue of high capacity wells in Wisconsin.

WATER QUALITY

Under current law, DNR, in conjunction with DATCP and local governmental units, administers a program to provide financial assistance for measures to reduce water pollution from nonpoint (diffuse) sources. Local governmental units annually apply for cost—sharing grants from DNR for new nonpoint source projects. A project qualifies for funding only if it is in a target area. An area may be a target area if it contains an animal feeding operation that has received a notice from DNR that the animal feeding operation is discharging a significant amount of pollution to the waters of this state (a notice of discharge). DNR ranks all of the eligible applications based on specified criteria, including the extent to which the project will result in the attainment of water quality objectives, and then DNR selects projects to receive cost—sharing grants. This process is sometimes referred to as the targeted runoff management grant process.
