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The Adopt-a-River Program encourages volunteers to "adopt" a section of a lake, river, wetland or ravine to ensure its long-term health through annual cleanups. Volunteers choose their own site from shorelines that have not yet been adopted. The program supplies "how-to" assistance, free rubbish bags, gloves and recognition after a reporting of cleanup results. Information tracked includes pounds of rubbish collected, volunteer hours, and descriptions of the debris found.

Fiscal Impact: Unknown

Location/Status: New motion

### **E. Lake Management Grants for Wetlands Enhancement/Restoration**

Earmark \$250,000 in 2001-02 and \$250,000 in 2002-03 from Lake Management Grants for local units of government that have completed a comprehensive land use plan and included a wetlands enhancement or restoration project in that plan.

Fifty, \$10,000 grants shall be awarded to local units of governments on a first come, first serve basis. In addition, those grant monies must be utilized for the implementation of the wetlands project.

Finally, if a drainage district is located on or near the project site, the drainage district commission must sign-off on the project before grants monies are awarded.

## **3. Stewardship**

### **A. Stewardship Funding – Debt Service**

Reduce funding for the Stewardship Program by 5% of the debt service in each year. 2001 debt service is approximately \$47.5 million. Thus, this motion would reduce the current funding level by \$2.4 million for the biennium. If the debt service were to increase in following years, this motion would reduce funding for Stewardship by 5% of that debt service amount.

Affected agency: DNR

Fiscal Impact: Reduce \$2.4 million BR for 2001-03. Unknown for subsequent years.

Location/Status: New motion (Gunderson)

### **B. Stewardship Requirements**

Require 10% of all stewardship monies to be used for the purchase of land in incorporated areas. In addition, require all purchases of land and development rights to be

consistent with the local comprehensive plan of the community where the property or development rights to be purchased are located.

Finally, prohibit the DNR from entering into any agreement to purchase development rights or conservation easements using Stewardship dollars if that agreement is for more than 30 years.

Delete Stewardship earmark of \$135,000 for conservation easements along the Plover River in Marathon and Portage Counties.

## **4. Growth and Planning for Wisconsin's Future**

### **A. Shoreland Zoning**

Allow cities and villages to adopt their own shoreland zoning ordinance for annexed land. In addition, allow local governments to utilize a 75-foot setback or the average of abutting property setbacks.

Agency affected: DNR

Fiscal Impact: \$0

Location/Status: New motion (Albers)

### **B. Notice Requirements to Affected Persons by Zoning Actions**

Require a city, village, town or county or a sub-unit of a political subdivision to provide to people who request, a notice of a proposed new or an amendment to an existing zoning ordinance, land division ordinances, or comprehensive plans.

The notice shall at a minimum include a map of affected properties, a description of the affect, or information regarding how to obtain a specific information from the political subdivision or sub-unit of the political subdivision. This would extend to actions taken by appointed committees appointed for the purposes of developing comprehensive plans or portions of comprehensive plans and supporting ordinances.
