Motion: Require a ~~50-50 match with the City of Milwaukee whereby the City would be required to offer financial incentives to the businesses within the Zone up to \$2.35 million.~~

- a) **Work Permit Automated System and Fee Increase (at the request of Rep. Stone)**
Request #181
The Governor's budget provides expenditure authority of \$162,500 in 2001-02 and \$325,000 in 2002-03 to fund development and maintenance of an automated child work permit system and to maintain existing services in the Division of Equal Rights. This funding would come through a \$2.50 increase in the child labor work permit or certificate of age fee, which is currently \$5.00, to \$7.50. The system would be used to issue work permits and certificates of age on-line and to maintain a central file of edited and issued work permits and certificates. The Joint Finance Committee deleted authority to use fee revenues for general operations and reduced the work permit fee to \$2.00, which would bring the total fee to \$7.00 (or \$0.50 less than the Governor's budget provided).

Motion: **Eliminate any increase in the work permit fee.**
(Savings - \$390,000PR)

- b) **Liability for Incarceration Costs (at the request of Rep. Powers)**

Under a 100-year old state law, a person could be incarcerated for the failure to pay their debts as part of civil action brought on by a creditor. Under this law, a jailer could collect from the creditor, in advance, the costs associated with the incarceration of the debtor. Those costs could include any medical and hospital expenses. Furthermore, the law specifies that payment by the creditor must be made within 24 hours of the imprisonment of the debtor.

Motion: **Repeal this state statute.**

- c) **Remodeling Contractor Member on Uniform Dwelling Code Council**
***Not Original Request of Caucus* (Pleva has language)**
The Uniform Dwelling Code Council is a 17-member council that reviews the standards and rules for one and two-family dwelling construction. The council recommends a uniform dwelling code for adoption by the Department. Council membership includes representation from the interested parties including trade labor organizations, municipal building inspectors, contractors, manufacturers and associated building entities. The council does not included representation from the remodeling industry.

Motion: **Require the Department to add a member to the Uniform Dwelling Code Council representing remodeling contractors actively engaged in the remodeling one and two-family housing.**

d) Forward Wisconsin (at the request of Sen. Welch)

***Senate Republican Caucus Amendment #240* (NUMBERS ARE DIFFERENT)**

Forward Wisconsin is a non-profit organization created to attract businesses to Wisconsin. It also markets the state as a destination for job seekers and to attract former residents to help address labor shortages. The Governor's budget recommended allocating \$200,000 from tribal gaming revenues to Forward Wisconsin in fiscal year 2002-2003. The Joint Finance Committee eliminated this allocation.

**Motion: Require the Commerce Department to provide \$100,000 in fiscal year 2002-2003 to Forward Wisconsin.
(Fiscal Effect: \$100,000 PR)**

e) Legislative Departmental Review (at the request of Rep. Seratti)

Not Original Request of Caucus

The Commerce Department operates a variety of grant and loan programs. In many cases, private and non-profit entities are eligible for these funds. In certain instances, the funding is provided as either a biennial or annual continuing appropriations. For example, Forward Wisconsin is provided \$500,000 (GPR) in base funding from the Commerce Department.

**Motion: Require all private and non-profit entities that receive base level funding from the Commerce Department to report and appear before the appropriate legislative standing committee to justify their continuing appropriation.

f) Manufacturing Extension Grants (at request of Rep. Fitzgerald)

***Request #270* (FUNDING SOURCE IS DIFFERENT)**

The Wisconsin Manufacturing Extension Partnership (WMEP) provides process improvement and technology services to small and medium-sized manufacturers. WMEP is operated by an organization that includes the Commerce Department, UW System, WTCS, Marquette University, MSOE, labor and business. The Governor recommended \$1 million annually from tribal gaming revenues for Manufacturing Extension Grants. The Joint Finance Committee modified the request to \$1 million over the biennium.

**Motion: Provide the Wisconsin Manufacturing Extension Partnership \$500,000 annually from the tribal gaming revenues the repayments appropriation of the Wisconsin Development Fund. This is in addition to the appropriation from JFC; and furthermore, this requirement sunsets on June 30, 2003.
(Fiscal Effect: \$1,000,000 PR)**

h) Prevailing Wage Rate - Contractor Records (at the request of Rep. Hundertmark)

Request #174

Under current law, DWD determines the prevailing wage rates for all types of state and local public works projects and investigates alleged violations of the prevailing wage

d) School Calendar Permissive Subject of Collective Bargaining (at request of Rep. Vrakas)

RACI PG Under current law, school districts are required to bargain collectively in good faith with the majority representative of its employees in a collective bargaining unit concerning the wages, hours, and conditions of employment of employees. Among the subjects that are mandatory subjects of collective bargaining is any school calendar proposal that is primarily related to wages, hours and conditions of employment.

Motion: Eliminate requirement that a school district is required to bargain collectively with respect to establishment of a school calendar, but require the school district to bargain collectively with respect to the *impact* of any school calendar decisions on wages, hours and conditions of employment.
(No Fiscal Effect)

~~e) School Calendar Four Day, Labor Day weekend (at request of Rep. Seratti)~~

~~Under current law, a school district is prohibited from starting the school term before September 1st (unless in that school year the school board hold a public hearing and adopts a resolution approving an earlier starting date). The "September 1st School Start Date" law does not speak to the Friday preceding Labor Day.~~

~~**Motion:** Prohibit school districts from scheduling the Friday before Labor Day as a school day.

Summary The Potosi Brewery, located in Grant County, was built in 1852, and is on the National Registry of Historic Places. This amendment would provide funding to the non-profit Potosi Brewery Foundation Inc for the following items related to this historic structure:

development of a historic structure report;
restoration and salvage;
a marketing plan; and
restoration project fundraising.

The amendment would provide \$150,000 from Tourism's GPR marketing appropriation to the non-profit Potosi Brewery Foundation, Inc.

One grant of \$30,000 will be used for a historic structure report.
Another grant of \$120,000 will be used for the marketing plan and restoration project.

The foundation will be required to match the \$120,000 grant.

Fiscal Impact This amendment earmarks \$150,000 in Tribal Gaming Revenue to the Potosi Brewery Foundation Inc.
