y This motion would enact several great traditions in public schools.

PG 1. Flag-in-every-classroom (AB 343) Beginning in 2005-06 school year, the U.S. flag must be displayed in every public and private school classroom. Every public and private school must offer the Pledge of Allegiance or the National Anthem in grades one to twelve each school day.

PG 2. School Uniforms (AB 255). Specifically authorize a school board to adopt a policy that requires all pupils enrolled in the school district, or all pupils enrolled in one or more schools in the school district to wear a uniform while in school or under the supervision of a school authority.

- 1.) If a school board adopts such a policy, it must allow a parent or guardian to exempt his or her child from the policy; ensure that no pupil is penalized academically or otherwise discriminated against because the pupil's parent or guardian has chosen to exempt the pupil from the policy; and give parents and guardians at least three months' notice before implementing the policy, and assist economically disadvantaged pupils to obtain the uniforms.
- 2.) The motion specifies that the requirement to adopt a policy does not apply to any school board that has in effect on the date on which this bill becomes law a school uniform policy and has had such a policy in effect continuously since that date.
- 3.) The motion directs DPI to report to the Legislature by July 1, 2005. The report must address all of the following issues: methods of encouraging the involvement of parents and guardians in a school board's decision to require school uniforms; the ability of pupils to purchase the uniforms; and the effect of the imposition of the requirement on crime in school, and on pupil suspensions and expulsions.

mjl 3. Marriage Instruction in Schools (AB 125). Provide that if a school board offers instruction in subjects relating to human sexuality, it must also offer instruction in marriage and parental responsibility.

mjl 4. Special Observance Days in Schools. Require the following school special observance days to be specifically listed (currently only the dates are listed): Lincoln's Day, Washington's Birthday, Columbus Day and Veterans Day. In addition, designate April 19 as a special observance day to be known as "Patriot's Day," commemorating the day in 1775 when the towns of Lexington and Concord were marched upon by British regulars in an effort to confiscate local militias' munitions and thereby marked the opening events of the War of the Revolution.

PG 5. Use of calculators (AB 293). Prohibits a pupil from using a calculator while taking the fourth grade knowledge and concepts examination.

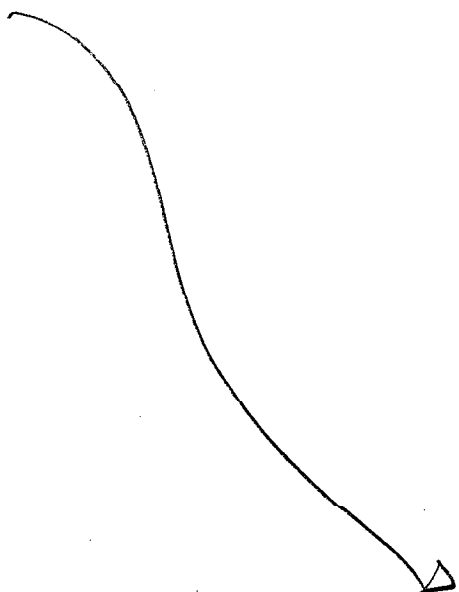
