March 8, 2001 – Introduced by Senators ROSENZWEIG, ROBSON, ROESSLER, GEORGE, DARLING, SCHULTZ and BURKE, cosponsored by Representatives JESKEWITZ, RILEY, LADWIG, BOCK, POWERS, KRAWCZYK, OLSEN, STASKUNAS, MUSSER, ALBERS, BERCEAU, MILLER, LASSA, TOWNSEND and SYKORA. Referred to Committee on Human Services and Aging.

1 **AN ACT relating to:** requiring the department of workforce development to
2 submit to the governor, the joint committee on finance, the department of
3 administration, and certain standing committees a statewide plan for
4 providing employment and support services to low-income, noncustodial
5 parents.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the department of workforce development (DWD) to submit to the governor, the department of administration, the joint committee on finance, and the appropriate standing committees of the legislature a plan for providing employment and support services to low-income, noncustodial parents. The employment and support services outlined in the plan must include services to provide job training, job readiness skills training, transportation assistance, parenting skills training, legal assistance, basic skills training, health care, and other support services. In developing the plan, DWD must consult with the department of health and family services in determining the health care services to be provided under the plan and must conduct at least two meetings in the state for the purpose of soliciting input on the plan from interested parties.
