requirements. Each contractor and subcontractor that performs work on a project subject to the prevailing wage provisions is required to maintain payroll records. Those records may be obtained and examined by the Department, the contracting agency. Once the Department or other public agency obtains these records they become public records.

The Joint Finance Committee adopted a motion to require all contractors and subcontractors that work on projects subject to state prevailing wage laws to maintain payroll records for the projects as public records.

Under current law, DWD determines the prevailing wage rates for state and local public works projects for an area by compiling the wages and benefits paid for a majority of the hours worked in the trade or occupation on projects in the area and determining a prevailing wage rate using that data. In determining the wage rates, DWD cannot include the wages from state, local and federal public works projects.

The Joint Finance Committee adopted a motion to allow the reporting of wages paid for public works projects on the annual wage rate survey used to determine prevailing wages when the wage rate paid on a public works project is more than the prevailing wage rate established for the project.

Motion: Delete Joint Finance Committee provision.

***Not Original Request of Caucus* (Pleva has language)**

Under current law, DWD determines the prevailing wage rates for state and local public works projects and establishes classifications and job duties for occupations subject to the prevailing wage. Metal building erectors assemble prefabricated packaged metal buildings according to blueprint specifications and their duties mirror this classification.

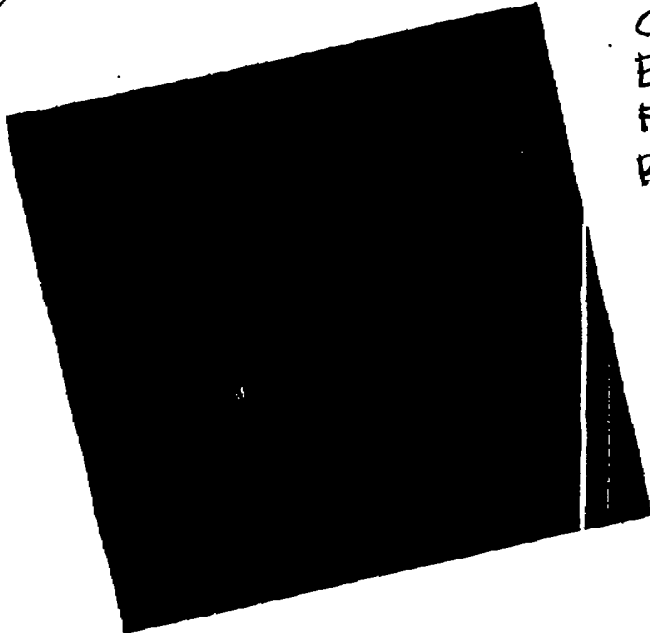

PRIMARY PURPOSE:

Assembles prefabricated metal building systems and other assembling of metal building components for use in constructing canopies, reroofs, and mezzanines, according to blueprint specifications using hand and power tools, aerial lifts, fork lifts and cranes when such buildings or other assembled materials are manufactured as a unit by a prefabricated metal building manufacturer or by one of its component suppliers. Also installs and repairs buildings and structures, structural members and fixtures made of steel and corrugated sheet metal provided by a prefabricated metal building manufacturer or by one of its component suppliers.

TYPICAL DUTIES:

Erects prefabricated primary and secondary steel framing for buildings and repairs, reroofs and resheeting, regardless of fastening method or the object to which it is fastened. Bolts or welds steel frame members together. Attaches wire, rod cable, straps and insulation material installed in conjunction with sheeting or frame work. Reads blueprints to determine location of items such as doors, windows, louvers, ventilators, skylights, bar joist, bearing pads, metal floor decking, ladders, stairways, handrails, walkways, platforms and catwalks and installs same using cutting torch, wrenches and power tools. Trims excess metal specified for use in connection with or incidental to gutters and downspouts, roof curbs, louvers, ridges, copings, hips, valleys, roof flanges, flashings, wall cap, mansards, skylights, columns and any and all other shapes and forms of corrugated or flat metal work specified for use for decorative or display purposes or as trim on the exterior of buildings or structures using power or hand tools.
