STUDY OF IMPROVEMENTS TO STH 11/USH 14 BETWEEN JANESVILLE AND I-43

Senate: Require DOT to conduct a study of the transportation corridor between Janesville and I-43 along STH 11 and USH 14. Specify that the study shall develop and evaluate various alternatives for improving the capacity and safety of transportation in the corridor.
