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

TO SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,

TO 2001 SENATE BILL 55

1 At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

2 1. Page 205, line 21: after that line insert:

3 “(fp) Food pantry grants and adminis-

4 tration GPR A 1,500,000 1,500,000”.

5 2. Page 356, line 18: after that line insert:

6 “SECTION 701h. 20.435 (3) (fp) of the statutes is created to read:

7 20.435 (3) (fp) *Food pantry grants and administration.* The amounts in the
8 schedule for costs of administering the grant program under s. 46.766 (5) and for
9 grants awarded under s. 46.766 (2).”.

10 3. Page 574, line 4: after that line insert:

1 "SECTION 1568c. 46.766 of the statutes is created to read:

2 **46.766 Food pantry grants.** (1) In this section:

3 (a) "Nonprofit organization" means an organization described in section 501 (c)
4 of the Internal Revenue Code.

5 (b) "Rural" means outside a metropolitan statistical area specified under 42
6 CFR 412.62 (ii) (A) or within a metropolitan statistical area but isolated from an
7 urban center.

8 (2) (a) From the appropriation under s. 20.435 (3) (fp), the department shall
9 provide annual grants to food pantries that meet the eligibility requirements under
10 sub. (4). The amount of each grant awarded to a food pantry shall be in proportion
11 to the number of persons served by the food pantry.

12 (b) The department shall allocate 25% of the amounts appropriated under s.
13 20.435 (3) (fp) for grants to rural food pantries. The department shall allocate the
14 remainder of the amounts available for grants under s. 20.435 (3) (fp) for grants to
15 all food pantries. If, after awarding the grants to rural food pantries, any of the
16 moneys remain unallocated, the department shall distribute the unallocated
17 amounts for grants to all food pantries in proportion to the number of persons served
18 by those food pantries.

19 (c) The total amount of all grants awarded annually to each food pantry under
20 this section may not exceed \$15,000.

12 (b) The food pantry is a nonprofit organization or is affiliated with a nonprofit
13 organization.

14 (c) The food pantry distributes food packages directly, without charge, to needy
15 households.

16 (d) The food pantry is open to the general public in its service area.

17 (e) The food pantry does not base food distribution on any criteria other than
18 need of the recipient, except to the extent necessary for the orderly and fair
19 distribution of food.

20 (f) The food pantry has a permanent address, regular hours of operation, and
21 is open at least one day per month.

22 (g) The food pantry adheres to the U.S. department of agriculture food safety
23 and food storage standards.

1 (5) The department may not use more than 5% of the total amount
2 appropriated under s. 20.435 (3) (fp) for administration of the grant program under
3 this section.

4 (6) A food pantry that receives a grant under this section shall, not later than
5 60 days after the end of the grant period, submit a report, not longer than 3 pages,
6 to the department in the manner prescribed by the department by rule, that
7 describes how the grant money was used by the food pantry. The department shall
8 compile the reports and submit the compiled reports to the legislature under s.
9 13.172 (2).".

11 ~~"(4g) FOOD PANTRY GRANT RULES. Not later than the first day of the 6th month
12 beginning after the effective date of this subsection, the department of health and
13 family services shall promulgate any rules necessary to implement the grant
14 program under section 46.766 of the statutes, as created by this act. Prior to
15 promulgating the rules, the department of health and family services shall convene
16 a committee to advise the department regarding the department's proposed rules.
17 The committee shall be composed of all of the following:~~

- 18 (a) One representative of an emergency food provider.
19 (b) One representative of a food bank.
20 (c) One representative of a community action agency.
21 (d) One representative of a faith-based social services organization.
22 (e) One representative of the University of Wisconsin-Extension with
23 experience in hunger prevention policies.

“(4^h) PLAN FOR DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD PANTRY GRANTS. Notwithstanding section 46.766 of the statutes, as created by this act, no later than ^ethe 90 days after the effective date of this subsection, the department of health and family services shall submit to the joint committee on finance a plan for distributing the grants to food pantries under section 46.766 of the statutes, as created by this act. If the cochairpersons of the committee do not notify the department of health and family services within 14 working days after the date on which the department submitted the plan that the committee intends to schedule a meeting to review the plan, the department shall implement the plan. If, within 14 working days after the date on which the department submitted the plan, the cochairpersons of the committee notify the department that the committee intends to schedule a meeting to review the plan, the department may implement the plan only as approved by the committee.”.
