Define "Alzheimer's disease" for purposes of the law enforcement training requirements to mean a degenerative disease of the central nervous system characterized especially by premature senile mental deterioration, and also includes any other irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties with concomitant emotional disturbance resulting from organic brain disorder.

9. LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING ON DOMESTIC ABUSE

Senate: No change to Joint Finance.

Assembly: Expand the current law requirement that the prepatory program of law enforcement training include an adequate amount of training to enable officers to deal effectively with domestic abuse incidents, to include training that addresses the emotional and psychological effect that domestic abuse has on victims.

10. HOTLINE FOR REPORTING DANGEROUS WEAPONS IN SCHOOLS

Senate: No change to Joint Finance.

Assembly: Require DOJ to maintain a toll-free telephone number for persons to provide information anonymously regarding dangerous weapons in public schools. Require DOJ to use the same toll-free telephone number for this purpose that it currently uses for: (a) persons to anonymously provide tips regarding suspected controlled substances violations; and (b) pharmacists to report suspected controlled substances violations.
