

Rebecca,

I am looking at the sheet that you sent over with information about three appropriations on it on which you have written "needs to go into forestry either way." I think that (8) (mk) is taken care of in the draft already through the creation of 20.375 (2) (k) and the position changes on page 152, lines 22 to 24, and page 155, lines 1 to 3.

As for (8) (ir), it seems as though that money could go into 20.375 (2) (h) or (3) (h), but if that is not possible, we will have to create another appropriation.

Finally, if the new agency is going to have a debt service appropriation, like 20.370 (7) (eq), there will also have to be a new capital improvement appropriation in s. 20.866 (2), and I think that the amount in s. 20.866 (2) (tu) will have to be amended to reduce DNR's bonding authority. We would need to know the amount of bonding authority that should be given to DF and taken away from DNR.
