Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill designates April 9th as "Prisoners of War Remembrance Day" and requires the governor to issue annually a suitable proclamation for the observance of the day and to request that some portion of the day be used for solemn contemplation on the plight of U.S. prisoners of war. The bill also requires schools to appropriately observe the day.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 14.16 (10) of the statutes is created to read:
