## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill would provide various rights to employees returning from national guard or state defense force service and provides a method for those employees to enforce their rights. Employees of the State of Wisconsin who feel their rights under the bill had been violated could seek enforcement of those rights by filing a complaint with the Personnel Commission. Employees of other employers in Wisconsin would initiate their enforcement proceedings with the Department of Workforce Development.

This estimate only addresses the fiscal consequences on the Personnel Commission of the enforcement procedure before the Commission. The estimate does not reflect the costs to state agencies associated with defending the claims permitted by the bill.

The Commission assumes that the number of complaints filed with the Commission would approximate the number of claims now filed under that portion of the Wisconsin Fair Employment Act (subch. II, ch. 111, Wis. Stats.) prohibiting discrimination based on membership in the national guard, state defense force or any reserve component of the military forces of the United States or Wisconsin (hereafter referred to as "national guard membership.")

During the 4 year period from 1997 through 2000, 12 of the 836 complaints filed with and processed by the Commission included claims alleging discrimination based on national guard membership. Eight of those 12 cases included claims of other forms of discrimination/retaliation, such as age or sex.

The Commission assumes there would be no more than 2 additional cases filed with the Commission annually due to the language in the bill. Existing staff would be able to absorb this nominal estimated increase in caseload without additional expenditures.
