## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law generally requires a person who is operating a public warehouse to obtain a license from the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection. A public warehouse is a warehouse that is operated for the storage of the property of others for compensation. Current law exempts several categories of entities from the requirement to obtain a public warehouse keeper's license, including municipalities and cooperative associations storing farm products and merchandise for members.

This bill exempts an agricultural society, association, or board that conducts a county or district fair, and receives state aid for the fair, from the requirement to obtain a public warehouse keeper's license.
