**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

**Bill Summary:**

This bill would alter the system for awarding preference points for issuing Class A bear hunting licenses. Under the current system maintained by the Department, an applicant may apply for a license or may apply for only a preference point if he or she is not seeking a license for the upcoming bear hunting season. Applicants under the current system need not be eligible to receive a hunting license in order to apply for and begin accumulating preference points. This bill would require applicants to be eligible for a bear hunting license for the upcoming bear hunting season, by requiring applicants for preference points to be at least 12 years old and be eligible for a hunting license on the first day of the upcoming bear hunting season.


**Fiscal Estimate:**

This bill has no fiscal impact on the Department. The Department already has in place an automated system for maintaining bear hunting preference points that identifies applicants by age so that the Department and vendors will be able to identify applicants that are not eligible to apply for preference points. There are currently approximately 68,000 applicants in the system, and it is estimated that this bill would affect less than 5 applicants. There may be some minor revenue fluctuations relating to permit application fees, but these would be insignificant, and indeterminate.

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
