Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

There are approximately 1950 massage therapists and body workers which will need to have their credential changed to a license. This involves the cost of designing and implementing the new license, printing and malling. The cost of recredentialing is estimated at \$11 per holder or \$21,450. The bill also calls for the issuance of temporary

Current rules will need substantial revision which is estimated at 300 hours at a cost of \$50 per hour. (\$15,000).

In establishing the new board there will be significant new expenses incurred. The new board would have 7 members that would meet about 6 times per year. The board would need to meet several times initially in the revision of rules and establishing continuing education requirements. It is estimated that board costs would be about \$14,000.

The addition of continuing education requirements will require the department to approve coursework and institutions as well as audit and monitor attainment of the continuing education by the licensees. The cost of these activities will be approximately \$7,500.

It is assumed that there will be no increased cost of enforcement.

To accomplish these tasks and provide on going support to the board a .5 FTE attorney and a .5 FTE program assistant 3 would be needed.
