3 **SECTION 19. Nonstatutory provisions.**

4 (1) PLAN. If the department of natural resources determines that there are  
5 insufficient funds available under section 20.370 (5) (fs) of the statutes, as created  
6 by this act, for the management of, and testing for, chronic wasting disease in cervids  
7 during fiscal year 2002-03, the department may develop a plan, for submission to the  
8 joint committee on finance for review, detailing the means by which the department  
9 shall manage, and test for, chronic wasting disease in cervids. If the department  
10 develops a plan under this subsection, the department shall recommend funding  
11 sources and expenditures for implementing the plan. In making these  
12 recommendations, the department may not do any of the following:

18 (a) If the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance do not notify the  
19 department of natural resources within 14 working days after the date of the  
20 submittal of the plan under subsection (1) that the committee has scheduled a  
21 meeting for the purpose of reviewing the plan, all of the following shall apply:

- 22 1. The department shall implement the plan.  
23 2. If the plan specifies the expenditure of funds from a segregated fund other  
24 than the conservation fund, the funds are transferred to the conservation fund.

1           3. The appropriation under section 20.370 (5) (fv) of the statutes, as created by  
2 this act, is supplemented from the appropriation under section 20.865 (4) (u) of the  
3 statutes by the amount specified under the plan.

4           (b) If, within 14 working days after the date of the submittal by the department  
5 of natural resources, the cochairpersons of the joint committee on finance notify the  
6 department that the committee has scheduled a meeting to review the plan, the  
7 department may not implement the plan without approval of the committee. The  
8 committee may disapprove or modify the plan. If the committee modifies the plan,  
9 the committee may transfer funds to the conservation fund from another segregated  
10 fund as is necessary to implement the plan. Notwithstanding section 13.101 (3) (a)  
11 of the statutes, no finding is required to be made that an emergency exists before  
12 transferring the funds under this paragraph.

13           (3) DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES POSITIONS. The authorized FTE positions  
14 for the department of natural resources are increased by 3.0 SEG project positions,  
15 to be funded from the appropriation under section 20.370 (5) (fs) of the statutes, as  
16 created by this act, for the purpose of managing and testing for chronic wasting  
17 disease.

18           (4) EMERGENCY RULES RELATING TO CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE IN CERVIDS.

19           (a) Notwithstanding section 227.24 (2) (a) of the statutes, the joint committee  
20 for review of administrative rules may extend the effective period of emergency rules  
21 promulgated by the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection  
22 relating to chronic wasting disease in cervids that took effect on April 9, 2002, for  
23 periods specified by the committee and may grant any number of extensions, except  
24 that the committee may not extend the effective period of the rules beyond  
25 September 1, 2003.

1           (b) The department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection may amend  
2 the emergency rules described in paragraph (a), while those rules are in effect, using  
3 the procedure in section 227.24 of the statutes, and any amendment remains in effect  
4 for the period provided under paragraph (a).

5           (c) Notwithstanding section 227.24 (2) (a) of the statutes, the joint committee  
6 for review of administrative rules may extend the effective period of any emergency  
7 rules promulgated by the department of natural resources that relate to the  
8 management of chronic wasting disease for periods specified by the committee and  
9 may grant any number of extensions, except that the committee may not extend the  
10 effective period of the rules beyond September 1, 2003.

11           (d) The department of natural resources may amend the emergency rules  
12 described in paragraph (c), while those rules are in effect, using the procedure in  
13 section 227.24 of the statutes, and any amendment remains in effect for the period  
14 provided under paragraph (c).

15           (5) VETERINARY DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY.

16           (a) The department of natural resources shall expend, in fiscal year 2002–03,  
17 a total of \$901,600 from the appropriations under section 20.370 (5) (fs) and (fv) of  
18 the statutes, as created by this act, for the purpose of testing cervids for chronic  
19 wasting disease by the veterinary diagnostic laboratory.

20           (b) The authorized FTE positions for the board of regents of the University of  
21 Wisconsin System are increased by 6.0 PR positions, to be funded from the  
22 appropriation under section 20.285 (1) (kg) of the statutes, for the purpose of testing  
23 cervids for chronic wasting disease by the veterinary diagnostic laboratory.
