Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SUMMARY OF BILL - This bill authorizes Conservation Wardens to enforce the trespass law, fine-tunes warden authority related to shooting of caged or staked wild animals, and permits wardens to make arrests under warrants issued for misdemeanors.

FISCAL IMPACT - Trespass enforcement: It can be assumed that conservation wardens, in the course of their regular duty, will deal with approximately 750 cases of trespass annually. The extra time involved as a result of enforcing the trespass law will average about 1 hour per incident. This additional 750 hours of time can be absorbed by the agency under its current budget; this allotement of 750 hours (750/2080 full time hours) relates to ~0.33 FTE position. Given the average salary of the a DNR warden at \$20.25 per hour, the current average salary cost of 1.0 FTE is \$73,046.

Average Warden Salary \$20.25 \$42,120 Fringe (2001 rate) \$22,745 Overtime Budgeted \$8,181 Total \$73,046

One-third of this average salary is \$24,349. The Department will be able to absorb these costs internally by spreading the expense and time across the current warden workforce.

Shooting at caged and staked wild animals enforcement: Due to the relatively small number of incidents involving shooting at caged or staked wild animals, this will have no measureable fiscal impact upon the agency.

Processing misdemeanor arrest warrants: Since the number of misdemeanor arrest warrants processed by the wardens is expected to be low, this will have a relatively minor fiscal impact on the agency.
