Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill permits a juvenile court to order a child who is at least 12 years of age and who is a custodial or expectant mother and is found to be receiving inadequate care and to be in need of a safe and structured living arrangement, to be placed in a group home that has been licensed to provide such a safe and structured living arrangement. The bill also requires that the parents of such children be notified of the proceedings and be represented by counsel regardless of their ability to pay.

It is not known how many such proceedings would occur but it is expected that the circuit court would have to absorb the additional workload with existing court staff. There would also be additional guardian ad litem costs for children involved in the proceedings as well as counsel costs for the parents that would be borne by the county. It is impossible to predict the additional county costs with the data available. It should be noted that s. 48.23(3) that is amended under this bill was ruled unconstitutional by the Wisconsin Supreme Court in 1996 as far as restricting the court's authority to appoint counsel and that counsel is presently being appointed in the circuit courts for parties other than children under s.48.13 by judges. These costs are significant and are also borne by the county.
