## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill contains several provisons which would allow for the creation of "second chance homes." Second chance homes are state-licensed group homes which exist solely to provide a safe and structured living arrangement for children 12 years of age or over who are custodial parents or expectant mothers. Second chance homes provide those children with life skills training which promotes independence and the well being of their children. The bill also contains language establishing a grant program for second chance homes to be administered by the Department. The grant program is not funded in the bill, which specifies the Department is to distribute not more than \$0 in grants in each fiscal year. The bill permits the juvenile court to place certain children in second chance homes under its (CHIPS) jurisdiction or a voluntary placement agreement.

Normally, to administer a grant program like that created in the bill, the Department would require 0.25 FTE (PPA 4), at an annual cost of approximately \$12,100 (\$10,500 GPR). However, since the bill specifies that no funding is to be distributed under the program, there would be no fiscal impact on the Department. This bill would also have no fiscal impact on local government health and social service agencies.
